*The County of Hereford and Worcester (Public Footpath in the Parish of Severn Stoke) Public Path Creation Order 1979.*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 7th December 1979 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the County Council of Hereford and Worcester.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to create a Public footpath in the Parish of Severn Stoke, commencing at a point at the end of the maintainable length of the UC9101 Ham Lanc, approximately 830 metres (908 yards) north-west of St. Dennis's Church, Severn Stoke and proceeding in a westerly direction for approximately 62 metres (68 yards) to the eastern bank of the River Severn and thence in a south-easterly direction along the eastern bank for approximately 1,480 metres (1,618 yards) to terminate at a point approximately 170 metres (186 yards) south-west of "Severn Bank". The total length of path to be created is approximately 1,542 metres (1,686 yards).
