Notice is hereby given that Buckinghamshire County Council propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which will be to prohibit any vehicle to wait at any time in the lengths of road below referred to.

The Buckinghamshire County Council (High Street South and Bridge Street, Olney) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order, 1979.

Notice is hereby given that on 5th December 1979, the Buckinghamshire County Council made the above-named Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order, which will come into operation on 17th December 1979, is to prohibit any vehicle from waiting in the length of road referred to in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions to the Order will permit:

1. Waiting with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden.
2. Waiting for so long as may be necessary: (a) for persons to board or alight; (b) goods to be loaded or unloaded; (c) for enabling works to be carried out; (d) in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; and
3. The waiting of disabled persons' vehicles in accordance with the "Orange Badge" Scheme.

The Buckinghamshire County Council (Vicarage Street, Woburn Sands) (Parking Places with Permits) Order, 19

Notice is hereby given that Buckinghamshire County Council propose to make an Order under sections 35, 36, 37 and 39 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended. The effect of the Order will be

To prohibit vehicles other than passenger vehicles, dual purpose vehicles with an unladen weight not exceeding 2 tons, disabled persons' vehicles, goods vehicles with an unladen weight not exceeding 1 ton or motor cycles owned by those residents of Vicarage Street, Woburn Sands, who have obtained a permit enabling them to park, from waiting in the area of highway described in the Schedule to this notice at any time on any day;

To enable the Council to levy a charge for the issue of permits such charge being £3 for a period of 12 months or £2 or £1 respectively if application for a permit is made between 8 and 4 months or less than 4 months respectively before the annual expiry date of permits;

To regulate the use of the areas specified for residents' vehicles.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to enable other vehicles to wait in the area set aside for residents' vehicles where those vehicles are being used in connection with building or demolition operations, the maintenance
