The Devon County Council (Footpath No. 27 Staddiscombe) Public Path Diversion Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 30th November 1979 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Devon County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert Footpath No. 27, situate at Staddiscombe in the Parish of Brixton, which starts from a point adjacent to Staddiscombe Road and runs diagonally in a south-south-easterly direction across field O.S. No. 1300 for a distance of approximately 157 metres to a point adjacent to Wembury Road, to a new line starting from the point adjacent to Staddiscombe Road at which the existing footpath starts and running in a south-easterly direction along the south-western side of the hedge on the north-eastern side of the same field for a distance of approximately 87 metres and then running in a southerly direction along the western side of the hedge on the eastern side of the same field for a distance of approximately 82 metres to the point adjacent to Wembury Road at which the existing footpath ends.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the office of the Area County Secretary (West Devon), 4th Floor, Civic Centre, Plymouth, and may be inspected there free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Thursdays and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Fridays.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Area County Secretary (West Devon), Devon County Council, Civic Centre, Plymouth, not later than Friday 11th January 1980 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Devon County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is

submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment with the Order.

Designation of Conservation Areas—Shouldham, Tottenhill Row and Hockwold-cum-Wilton

Notice is hereby given that the West Norfolk District Council on 6th December 1979, in pursuance of its powers under the above Acts have designated areas of land described in the Schedule to this notice as Conservation Areas.
