TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING GENERAL DEVELOPMENT ORDER 1977

Direction under Article 4

Notice is hereby given that the Norfolk County Council have made a Direction under article 4 of the above-mentioned Order relating to land in the Parish of North Walsham immediately to the west of the B1145, North Walsham By-Pass and to the south of Lyngate Road.

The effect of the Direction is to remove the following class of "permitted development" set out in paragraph 2 of Class IV of Schedule 1 to the General Development Order 1977:

The use of the land on not more than 14 days in total in any calendar year for the purpose of the holding of markets and the erection or placing of moveable structures on the said land for the purpose of that use.

The provisions of paragraph 3 (b) of article 4 apply to the Direction which becomes operative as from 17th December 1979 and remains in force for a period of 6 months and will then expire unless it has been confirmed by the Secretary of State for the Environment. With effect from the above date no development of the class referred to can be undertaken without specific planning permission.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

Public Footpath Diversion (Public Footpath No. 54 Cleobury Mortimer) Order No. 11 1979

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 12th December 1979, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the South Shropshire District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert that part of Footpath No. 54 Cleobury Mortimer running from the southern boundary of the field numbered 2747 on the 1/2500 Ordnance Survey Sheet S.O. 6675 (1977 Edition) in a generally north-north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 145 metres and then in a generally westerly direction for a distance of approximately 26 metres to a point approximately 11 metres east of the access to the junction of Tenbury Road and Eagle Lane to a route running from the southern boundary of the said field numbered 2747 in a generally west-north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 116 metres to the south-western corner of a building and garden plot to be laid out by the landowner and then in a generally north-north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 55 metres along the inside of the western boundary of the said plot to rejoin the existing route of Footpath No. 54 approximately 11 metres east of the access to the junction of Tenbury Road and Eagle Lane.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Stone House, Corve Street, Ludlow, between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 5 p.m., Mondays to Thursdays inclusive and 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. on Fridays.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Chief Executive, South Shropshire

District Council, Council Offices, Stone House, Corve Street, Ludlow, before 1st February 1980 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made or if any so made are withdrawn the South Shropshire District Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

The Metropolitan Borough of Stockport (Footpath No. 51, Miner Farm, Mill Lane, Woodley, Stockport) Public Path Diversion Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that on 22nd November 1979 the Stockport Metropolitan Borough Council confirmed the above-named Order as being unopposed. The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert four sections of a length of the public right of way No. 51 running from Mill Lane, Woodley, in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 125 metres across part of Miner Farm, to a line running in a generally south-westerly direction, the first three sections being to the south-east and the fourth section to the south-west side of the existing footpath.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Enquiry Desk, Town Hall, Stockport, and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m., Mondays to Fridays.

The Order becomes operative when it is certified by the Stockport Metropolitan Borough Council that an alternative highway for use as a replacement for the original footpath has been created to their reasonable satisfaction.

If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 within 6 weeks from 20th December 1979, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 11th December 1979 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Wiltshire County Council as an unopposed Order.
