*The West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council (Kirklees)
(Traffic Regulation) (No. 2) Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that the West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council have made the above Order under their powers in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which in relation to roads at Huddersfield is:

- (a) to close the gaps in the central reservation of Queensgate in the vicinity of Bradley Street and at its junction with the Polytechnic Car Park entrance (opposite Zetland Street);
- (b) to close the gap in the central reservation of Wakefield Road at its junction with Aspley Place;
- (c) to prohibit U-turns in Wakefield Road at its junction with Firth Street.

A copy of the Order, which comes into force on 4th January 1980, together with a plan showing the restricted roads, may be examined during normal office hours at the Reception Desk at the Main Entrance to County Hall, Wakefield and at the County Council's DoPET Office, Albion Street, Huddersfield.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, or on the grounds that any requirements of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within six weeks from the date upon which the Order was made (i.e. 11th December 1979) apply to the High Court for this purpose.

Public Path Diversion Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that on 21st November 1979 the Council of the Borough of South Tyneside confirmed the above-named Order.
