Shore Road, Caldy, Wirral Coast Protection Works

The Wirral Borough Council acting in their capacity as coast protection authority hereby give notice under sub-section (1) of section 5 of the above Act that they propose to carry out coast protection work as described herein at Shore Road, Caldy.

The works comprise of a rip-rap coast protection structure consisting of natural limestone armour units. The structure will stretch from the southern end of Cubbins Green, Caldy in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 280 metres along the toe of the existing clay cliffs, affording protection to eight properties in Shore Road, Caldy.
