GWYNEDD COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Gwynedd
(Various Streets, Beaumaris)
(Traffic Regulation) (Amendment) Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that on December 21st 1979 the Gwynedd County Council made the above-named Order under Section 1 (1) (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1965, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The Order which comes into force on January 4th 1980 makes it unlawful to leave a vehicle;

(a) In Rating Row, on both sides from its junction with the north-easterly side of Church Street for a distance of 50 metres in an easterly direction

(b) In Bunker's Hill, on its north-westerly side from a point 10 metres south-west of its junction with the south-westerly side of Steeple Lane to its junction with Gaol Street.

(c) Wexham Street, on its south-westerly side from a point 5 metres north-west of its junction with north-westerly side of Steeple Lane to its junction with the north-westerly side of Steeple Lane.

(d) Church Street, on its south-westerly side from its junction with south-easterly side of Steeple Lane to a point 15 metres south-east of its junction with the south-easterly side of Steeple Lane.

Exceptions will permit waiting for the purposes of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers
- (b) loading and un-loading of goods
- (c) delivery or collection of postal packets
- (d) taking in petrol (etc) from any garage
- (e) fire brigade, police or ambulance duties
- (f) authorised parking places and cab ranks and, where necessary, in connection with,
- (g) building, industrial or demolition operations
- (h) removal of traffic obstructions
- (i) maintenance of roads
- (j) supply of gas, electricity and water
- (k) local authorities' statutory powers and duties
- (l) weddings or funerals and, in specified cases, where the vehicle is a disabled person's vehicle

Full details are contained in the Order which, together with a map showing its effect may be examined at:

- (1) The Post Office, Beaumaris
- (2) The County Offices, Shirehall Street, Caernarfon during normal business hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from 21st December 1979 apply to the High Court for this purpose.—Dated 27th December 1979.
