### PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE

#### ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT 1931

Regulations made by the Architects Registration Council of the United Kingdom under section 13 of the above-mentioned Act have been submitted for the approval of the Privy Council and are published herewith. Representations by persons to whom the Regulations are applicable may be made in writing to the Privy Council on or before the 2nd day of February 1980.

#### REGULATIONS

Amend Regulation 40 to read as follows:

"Unless and until the Council otherwise direct the price of each copy of the Register mentioned in Section 3 of the Principal Act shall not exceed £10.00 but may be varied, as may the price mentioned in Regulation 31 and the admission fees mentioned in Regulation 37 sub paragraphs (a)-(d) inclusive, from time to time at the sole discretion of the Council."

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Accountant's Office (Bank Buildings) at the Bank of England

on Friday, 4th January 1980 at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £300,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, 100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 7th January 1980 to Friday, 11th January 1980 inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one new halfpenny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.

8. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
