The Cherwell District Council (Various Roads, Banbury) (Traffic Regulation) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the Cherwell District Council pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, with the Oxfordshire County Council, propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 of the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 of the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the proposed Order is to make permanent the measures contained in the Cherwell District Council (Various Roads) Experimental Traffic Regulation Order (Various Roads) Experimental Traffic Regulation Order 1977. These measures are (i) to restrict waiting between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. in London Yard, Cornhill, Market Approach, Market Place, Parsons Street, The Tchure and part of Old Bridge Street, Banbury; (ii) to regulate the direction of flow of traffic in Old Bridge Street; (iii) to prohibit the passage of traffic along Old Bridge Street, Market Place, Parsons Street, The Tchure and Butchers B A. M. Brace, Chief Executive

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Row, Banbury, except for the purposes of obtaining access to premises.

Exemptions in the Order will permit waiting for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers, loading and unloading goads, in connection with building operations, removal of obstructions to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and services therein, and in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

A further exemption will permit waiting by a vehicle which displays the relevant Disabled Persons Badge.

A copy of the draft Order, together with a map showing the lengths of road affected may be examined at the offices of the Council at the undermentioned address, and at Borough House, Marlborough Road, Banbury, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. Mondays to Fridays. Any objection to the proposed Order, together with the grounds on which it is made should be sent to the under-
