The regulations are intended to correct a deficiency in the Social Security Benefit (Dependency) Regulations 1977 (the "principal regulations") by re-prescribing, in new regulations 4A and 4B, the provisions of regulations 6 and 7 (child dependants) of the principal regulations and making them apply also to entitlement to increase of benefit in respect of a female person having care of a child.

They would prescribe the circumstances in which a person who is not entitled to child benefit is to be treated as so entitled or the purpose of qualifying for certain benefits in respect of children and for a female person caring for such children; and the circumstances in which a person who is entitled to child benefit is for these purposes to be treated as not so to child benefit is, for these purposes, to be treated as not so entitled.

The regulations would revoke regulations 6 and 7 of the principal regulations, which would be superseded by new regulations 4A and 4B.

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
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
