#### PASTORAL MEASURE 1968

Notice is hereby given that Her Majesty was pleased on the 13th February 1980 by Order in Council to confirm the following Schemes made by the Church Commissioners for

1. Uniting the parishes of Halvergate and Tunstall, in the diocese of Norwich, and declaring redundant the parish church of the parish of Tunstall.

2. Uniting the benefices of Pulham Saint Mary Magdalen; and Pulham Saint Mary the Virgin, in the diocese of Norwich; and altering the name of the parish of Pulham Saint Mary Magdalen.
3. Appropriating the redundant parish church of the former parish of Saint Thomas, Ardwick, in the diocese of Manchester, and the land annexed or belonging thereto, to use for office and community purposes and for purposes ancillary thereto; and empowering the said Commissioners to sell the said building and land for such uses.
4. Uniting the benefices of Halesworth with Linstead and Chediston; Holton (Saint Peter) with Blyford; and Spexhall with Wissett, in the diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and establishing a team ministry for the area of the new benefice.
5. Uniting the benefices of Curry Rivel; and Fivehead with Swell in the diocese of Bath and Wells.
6. Empowering the said Commissioners to sell or exchange the site of the former church of Saint Matthew, Leeds, and the land annexed or belonging thereto, in the diocese of Ripon.
7. Uniting the benefices of Burton Agnes with Harpham; Kilham; and Lowthorpe with Ruston Parva, in the diocese of York.
8. Uniting the benefices of Wheatley; Forest Hill; and Stanton St. John, in the diocese of Oxford.
9. Empowering the said Commissioners to sell, give or lease the site of the former chapel of ease of Saint Phillip, in the parish of Saint Andrew, Auckland, and the land annexed or belonging thereto, in the diocese of Durham.
10. Empowering them to sell or lease the site of the former church of Saint Barnabas, Rock Ferry, and the land annexed or belonging thereto, in the diocese of Chester.
11. Appropriating the redundant parish church of the parish of Saint George, Brinsworth, in the diocese of Sheffield, to use for making, painting and storing stage scenery and for purposes ancillary thereto; and empowering the said Commissioners to sell the said building for such uses.
12. Uniting the benefices of Normanby with Edston; and Salton, and altering the areas of the parishes of Barton le Street and Salton, in the diocese of York.
13. Uniting the benefices of Donhead Saint Andrew; and Donhead Saint Mary, with Charlton, in the diocese of Salisbury.
14. Establishing a team ministry for the area of the benefice of Halesowen, in the diocese of Worcester.
15. Appropriating the redundant churches of Saint Peter, Ipswich; Saint Lawrence, Ipswich; Saint Stephen, Ipswich; and Saint Clement, Ipswich, in the diocese of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and the lands annexed or belonging thereto to use for civic, public or educational purposes in connection with the Borough of Ipswich and empowering the said Commissioners to give the said buildings and lands for such uses.
