

Hermish, February 20. His Grace the Duke of Marlborough came to this Place yesterday in the Evening, and Embark'd this Morning about ten a-Clock, with a fair Wind, for Holland.

Plymouth, February 18. The 16th in the Night failed the York to the Westward; Yesterday failed the Essex and Kent with their Prize to the Eastward. Came in a Genoise from Holland, bound to Lisbon. This Day came in a Swede from Ireland, with Provisions for Stockholm.

Dartmouth, February 18. Yesterday failed hence the St. Anthony of and for Topsham, with Iron, Wine, Wooll, Canes, &c. from Bilboa, Nicholas Maier Master; and this Day failed hence the White Eagle of and for Rotterdam with Wines from Bourdeaux.

Cowes, February 19. Yesterday came in here a Dutch Runner, of twelve Guns, for the West-Indies, who lost her Foremast and Boitspirit in the late Storm.

Portsmouth, February 20. On Sunday Night last came up to Spithead Her Majesty's Ships the Kent and Essex from the Westward. The same Evening the Seahorse and Delight failed to Cruize. Last Night the Breda, Warpsight, Norwich, and Dispatch Brigantine failed from St. Hellens for the Downs, with the Homeward-bound Lisbon Fleet.

Deal, February 20. On the 18th in the Afternoon came down her Majesty's Ship the Sapphire, with the Mary and Catherine for Jamaica, the Samuel for Antegoa, and the Neptune Transport. And this Day came in her Majesty's Ships the Warpsight, Breda, Norwich and Dispatch Brigantine, and under their Convoy about one hundred Sail of homeward-bound from Lisbon, &c.
