

several considerable Alterations made in Civil as well as Military Employments. General Vellingh is said to be made a Senator of Sweden, and Governor of the Dutchies of Bremen and Verden, in the room of Field-Marshal Gyldenstern, who has already taken his leave of the States and Regency of Bremen, in order to retire to Sweden, where he is made President of the Council of War, with a Pension of six thousand Crowns a Year; and it is not doubted that that Count Vellingh has likewise the Command in chief over the Swedish Troops in Germany, as Count Gyldenstern had. It is reckon'd, that the Body of Forces in Pomerania consists of twelve thousand Men in a condition to March, besides the Garrisons; though the Swedes, by their Discourses, endeavour to lessen their Numbers, and say they are not able to stir for want of the necessary Sums of Money. Count Schonborn, the Imperial Commissioner, talks of going from hence by the latter end of next Month. It is wish'd that the Commission may be finished at the same time, tho' there are new Jealousies arisen between the Senate and the Burghers, and several other Matters relating to the Settlement of this Town, have no very promising Aspect. Dr. Krumboltz having receiv'd his Sentence of Imprisonment for Life, has been deliver'd into the Hands of those appointed by the Elector of Hanover to receive him. He is at present in the Castle of Harburg; but it is expected that he will soon be remov'd to Dannenberg, or Kalckberg, or some other Place in the Mountains of the Hartz, never to disturb this Town any more with his Seditious Practices. There has been no great Progress in the Commission relating to the Mecklenburg Affairs; and there are less hopes of Success here in those Disputes, since the Nobility have renew'd their Complaints at the Imperial Court.

Plymouth, February 20. Last Night came in here the Fortune, Postillion, and Four Brothers, all of and for Zurickzee from Ireland.

Tarmouth, February 21. This Day passed thro' our Road divers Coasters from the Northward, with their Convoy.

Deale, February 22. Her Majesty's Ships the Warspight, Breda, Norwich and Dispatch Brigantine sailed hence Yesterday toward the River. Here remain Her Majesty's Ships the Ruby and the Sapphire, with the Outward-bound Merchant-ships and Coasters.
