About the beginning of the last Month the Congress of the three Leagues of the Grisons took into Consideration the Treaty made in the Year 1707, for the Passage of the Troops of the Allies through their Territories, and finding, that after their repeated Complaints, they have not obtain'd the Satisfaction they expected from the House of Austria, in relation to feveral Articles of that Treaty, and that they lie under many Grievances which they take to be contrary to their Hereditary Treaty with the Imperial Family, as well as the Treaty aforemention'd, they came to a Resolution to acquaint the several Communities of this State with the whole Matter, and deire them to fend their Votes and Opinions to the next Congress, which was then adjourned to the beginning of this Month, and is to refume their meeting here to Morrow; with Intention, if in the mean time they had no redress from the Court of Vienna, to that up the Passages of these Mountains, and allow none of the Troops or Recruits of the Allies to go through this Coun-This Refolution was Communicated try to Italy. Milan, February 4. N. S. Signior Brentani having on all Occasions shown himself zealous for the Interests of the House of Austria, the Prince of Savoy, our Governor, has been pleased to make him Treasurer of the Milanese. They write from Rome, that the French do all they can to obstruct the Count de Bossu, Agent to the Cardinal de Bouillon at that Court, and to render his Negotiations ineffectual, notwithflanding which it is faid the Pope shows him much Respect, and has declared himself ready to espouse the Cardinal's Interest, so far as is considert with the Honour and Dignity of the Holy See. These Letters add, that the 3th of the last Month being the Anniversary of the Death of Pope Alexander VIII. the same was celebrated in St. Peter's Church, where the Rody of that Pope is deposited. The whole the Body of that Pope is deposited. The whole College of Cardinals assisted at that Solemnity, to which they were invited by Cardinal Ottoboni, Nephew to the Deceased.

Cologne, February 20. N. S. The Deputies of the Circle of Westphalia continue their Conferences, and it is thought that before they separate they will come to a Resolution of augmenting the Troops belonging to the Circle confiderably against the next Campaign. Great numbers of People having died lately in the Neighbourhood of this Place, of a Distemper supposed to be Contagious, all possible Precautions have been taken to prevent the spreading of it; and it is hoped the Weather, which is now grown very Cold, will put a flop to it. They write from Coblents, that the new E-lector of Treves has received his Bulls from Rome, and taken the accustom'd Oaths with the usual Ceremonies. Letters from Frankfort of the 11th Instant advise, that the Earl of Peterborough was

Rhine being frozen up, the Troops that are already policed along that River, are to be reinforc'd by those of Hesse-Darmstadt, that they may be in a condition to oppose the French, in case they make any Attempts during the Frost. Prince Lewis of Wolfembuttel continues indisposed at Brunswick; from whence Prince Galectin, the Muscovite Ambassador Extraordinary, is set out, having first settled all the Articles relating to the Match between the Hereditary Prince of Muscovy and the Princess of Wolfembuttel.

Dartmouth, February 23. On the 21st came in here two Dutch Doggers from Cork, laden with Butter and Hides, for Zealand.
