

Rhine being frozen up, the Troops that are already posted along that River, are to be reinforced by those of Hesse-Darmstadt, that they may be in a condition to oppose the French, in case they make any Attempts during the Frost. Prince Lewis of Wolfenbittel continues indisposed at Brunswick; from whence Prince Galeczin, the Muscovite Ambassador Extraordinary, is set out, having first settled all the Articles relating to the Match between the Hereditary Prince of Muscovy and the Princess of Wolfenbittel.

Falmouth, February 22. Just now sailed the Queen Packet-Boat, Capt. Culverden Commander, with three Mails for Lisbon, and Recruits for Spain.

Dartmouth, February 23. On the 21st came in here two Dutch Doggers from Cork, laden with Butter and Hides, for Zealand.

Yarmouth, February 23. This Day failed out of our Road divers Coasters to the Southward with their Convoy.

Deale, February 25. Here are Her Majesty's Ships the Ruby and Sapphire, with the Outward-bound Merchant-ships and Coasters. Yesterday in the Afternoon came down the Marlborough, Union, Martha, Mary and Francis, and the Mary and Elizabeth Transports; also the Pelican, bound for the Isle of May.
