TECHNICAL ANNEX TO PUBLIC NOTICE

8-in. Seawater Pipeline and 6-in. Oil Pipeline between the Beatrice Field AA Platform and the Beatrice Field BB Platforn

At the request of the Secretary of State for Energy, and as agreed by the Pipelines Inspectorate, the British National Oil Corporation presents the following information concerning the 8-in. seawater pipeline and 6-in. oil pipeline between the AA Platform and the BB Platform in the Beatrice Field.

Pre-Commissioning Testing

The pipelines will be tested to the satisfaction of the Pipelines

Inspectorate prior to commissioning.

Design Pressure

The maximum possible pressure in each pipeline will be less than the pressure for which the pipeline is designed.

Leak Detection

Pressure and flow will be monitored at all times. Provision will be made to ensure that the pipeline can be manually or automatically isolated from the rest of the facilities at each Platform. In the event that a leak is detected, an underwater survey will be carried out to locate it.

Emergency Action
In the event that a major break occurs in either pipeline, the

following emergency action will be taken:

1. All oil or seawater delivery into the pipeline will be

manually or automatically stopped.

Department of Energy Pipelines Inspectorate will be notified immediately.

An underwater survey will be carried out to determine the location of the break.

Should pollution result from the discharge of crude oil, the emergency pollution control systems held in constant readiness by the British National Oil Corporation and by the UK Offshore Operators Association will be mobilised.

Recommissioning

In the event of a pipeline break, contingency plans to be agreed with the Department of Energy Pipelines Inspectorate will be carried out for the repairing of the piepline and proving its integrity before putting it back into service. Trenching

The pipelines will be trenched as far as is practicable such that the tops of the pipelines are 1 metre below the level of the seabed.

Limits of Deviation

The pipeline will be laid within a boundary of 100 metres on either side of the agreed route.
