



Whereas it is expedient to provide for revised rates and conditions of award of retired pay, pensions, preserved pensions, terminal grants, preserved terminal grants, gratui-ties, resettlement grants and redundancy payments for Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of the Royal Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines, for members of Queen Alexan-dra's Royal Naval Nursing Service, and for Officers and Ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Service: and of pensions and gratuities to the widows and children of deceased Officers, Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865, (1865 c. 73) and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Non-Effective Benefits and Family Pensions) Order 1980.

General

2. The revised rates and conditions of award of retired pay, pensions, preserved pensions, terminal grants, pre-served terminal grants, gratuities, resettlement grants and A2

redundancy payments in respect of service in the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service and the Women's Royal Naval Service, and of pensions and gratuities to widows and children in respect of the service of deceased Officers, Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines shall be as specified in the Schedules annexed herets white the new provision therein limiting in any way hereto, subject to no provision therein limiting in any way the making of awards under the provisions of Order in Council ^{9*} of 25th July 1978.

3. Except as otherwise indicated the provisions con-tained in the Schedule to this Order shall have effect from 1st April 1979.

SCHEDULE 1 Section 1

1. The provisions of this section relate to officers holding permanent or pensionable commissions in the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service and the Women's Royal Naval Service who retire from the Active List on or after 1st April 1979. Subject to the provisions of the Forfeiture Act 1870 (1870 c. 23), the Admiralty Pensions Act 1921 (1921 c. 39) and Schedule III below, they relate also to retired officers whose commissions are terminated or whose names are removed from the list of Retired Officers because of misconduct. Except in the case of attributable invaliding they do not apply to officers holding temporary or short service commissions or officers on the Supplementary List who have not been granted permanent or pensionable commissions. There is no eligibility to receive an award under earlier regulations.

2. The rate of retired pay will be based on the officer's 2. The rate of retired pay will be based on the officer's rank for retired pay purposes as defined in Clauses 20 to 24 and on the length of his reckonable service calculated in accordance with Clause 25 of this Schedule. In the case of Service Attributable Retired Pay the rate is based on the officer's rank for retired pay purposes as defined in Clauses 20 to 24 and on the degree of disability.

Service Retired Pay

3. An officer who is permitted to cease employment, on attaining the age limit fixed for service in his rank and branch or is retired compulsorily, it having been decided that further employment is not available for him, may be granted retired pay appropriate to the rates shown in Clause 2 of Schedule IX provided that he has completed at least 16 years reckonable service as defined in Clauses 25 to 28 of this Schedule. In the event of eligibility for full pay continuing after formal retirement the award will take effect from the day following that in respect of which full pay was last payable except that, with effect from 30th Novem-ber 1978, an officer whose eligibility for full pay continues after he attains the age limit for service in his rank, list, and type of commission and who is aged 55 years or over may on being formally placed on the retired list be paid the terminal grant for which his service has qualified him. An officer who is under 55 years on being formally retired may not be paid his terminal grant until he attains the age of 55 years if still serving. An officer who serves beyond both the age limit for service in his rank or branch and beyond his 55th birthday may on actual retirement have his retired pay and balance of terminal grant assessed under the provisions of Cluse 2 of section 1 of Schedule IV as if he were a re-employed officer with the date of formal retirement or his 55th birthday, whichever is the later, being deemed to be the date of the original award of retired pay. An officer who continues to serve beyond the age of 55 years in a lower rank may from his 55th birthday or normal age for retirement if later be awarded a portion of his accrued retired pay as provided for in Clause 1 of section 1 of Schedule IV of this order for a re-employed officer.

Voluntary Retirement

4. An officer with at least 16 years' reckonable service who retires at his own request before reaching the normal retairement age for his rank, list and type of commission on or after reaching the age of 40 years and before reaching the age of 50 years may be granted retired pay at the rates set out in Clause 2 of Schedule IX abated by $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. Retired pay will be re-assessed at the age of 60 years in accordance with Clause 14 of Schedule III. For voluntary retirement at other ages the retired pay will be as indicated in Clause 2 of Schedule IX. An officer who serves for less than 5 years after the grant of his permanent and pen-sionable commission will not be eligible for retired pay on

voluntary retirement but may be awarded either a preserved pension in accordance with Schedule III or any service pension or gratuity for which he may be eligible by virtue of his service as a rating.

Retirement for marriage

5. A member of the Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service or an officer of the Women's Royal Naval Service who is permitted to retire on marriage or for com-Service who is permitted to retire on mariage or for com-passionate reasons where the Secretary of State is satisfied that such reasons necessitate retirement of termination of service is to be treated as retiring compulsorily for retired pay purposes. Permanent officers who have completed at least 4 years' service as officers and are permitted to retire or are required to terminate their service on marriage or for compassionate reasons where the Secretary of State for Defence is satisfied that such reasons necessitate retire-ment or termination of service and who are not eligible for non perfecte is satisfied that such reasons necessitate removes ment or termination of service and who are not eligible for the award of a preserved pension may be awarded a gratuity in respect of service given up to and including 5th April 1978 at the rates shown in Clause 5 of Schedule IX.

Service Invalidating Retired Pay

6. Officers serving on permanent and pensionable com-missions who are non-attributably invalided on or after the 1st April 1979 and who have completed at least 5 years' qualifying service of which at least 2 years have been served from the age of 21 years may be awarded Service Invaliding Retired Pay at the rates shown in Clause 3 of Schedule IX.

7. Where, however, an officer is invalided in his last year of service or where in the view of the Discretionary Awards Panel the circumstances of the case justify it, a lesser award may be made than that shown in Clause 3 of Schedule IX.

8. Where it would be more favourable to the officer, Service Invaliding Retired Pay will be reassessed at the age of 60 years under the terms for preserved pensions in Schedule III. In such a case a preserved terminal grant will also be awarded at the age of 60 years, the amount of which will be three times the difference between the original award of invaliding retired pay and the original rate of preserved pension, uplifted by the appropriate pensions increase measures in force before the officer's 60th bithday.

9. An officer who is non-attributably invalided with less than 5 years' qualifying service but with at least 2 years' qualifying service may be awarded a gratuity at the rates shown in Clause 6 of Schedule IX. These rates do not apply to officers serving on short career commissions and non-pensionable commissions.

Service Attributable Retired Pay

10. Irrespective of their length of service all officers, including those on short service commissions who are in-valided with a degree of disability assessed at 20 per cent. or more may be awarded Service Attributable Retired Pay provided such disability shall be accepted by the Depart-ment of Health and Social Security as being attributable to or aggravated by their period of service. The rank on which the award is based will be determined in the same way as for Service Invaliding Retired Pay. The award of Service Attributable Retired Pay will be at the minimum rate shown in Clause 4 of Schedule XI unless Service Invaliding Retired Pay is more favourable in which case the latter will apply. In either case the award will be tax-free. 10. Irrespective of their length of service all officers, tax-free.

11. Eligibility to receive an award of Service Attributable Retired Pay shall extend in time of general mobilisation or imminent national danger or emergency to officers of the Royal Naval Reserve, the Royal Marines Reserve, Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service Reserve and the Women's Royal Naval Reserve; also to members of University RN units who join as Honorary Midshipmen RNR but not to combined Cadet Forces officers or to Sea Cadet Corps officers other than those who are members of a reserve force specified above.

12. This award may be paid concurrently with any dis-ablement pension or other Department of Health and Social Security allowances except that Service Attributable Retired Pay will be abated by the amount of any Unemployability Supplement put into payment by the Department of Health and Social Security within 12 months of their determination of attributability provided the amount abated shall not exceed the excess of the minimum rate set out in Clause 4 of Schedule IX over the appropriate rate of Service In-midding Patient Pay. validing Retired Pay.

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13. Should the degree of disability increase at any time, the rate of Service Attributable Retired Pay will be review-ed. If the degree of disability decreases however, attributable retired pay will only be reviewed during the 12 months immediately following retirement unless the degree of dis-ability falls below 20 per cent in which case the rate of Attributable Retired Pay will be reduced to the rate of Service Invaliding Retired Pay for which the officer is eligible.

14. Where the rate of Service Attributable Retired Pay is reviewed the revised rate will be that appropriate to the revised degree of disability, at the rate current at the date of invaliding, enhanced where applicable by relevant pen-sions increase measures.

15. An adjustment to the excess of the minimum rate over the appropriate rate of Service Invaliding Retired Pay may be made in cases where an officer recovers damages for the injury which led to the attributable invaliding.

16. The excess of the minimum rate over the appropriate rate of Service Invaliding Retired Pay is not commutable.

17. In addition to any award of attributable retired pay under Clause 10 of this Schedule any officer invalided from attributable causes may be awarded either:

- (i) the terminal grant, if any, for which he would have been eligible on non-attributable invaliding plus an additional attributable gratuity if his degree of dis-ability is 20 per cent or more at the rates shown in Clause 7 of Schedule IX; or
 (ii) the gratuity which he would have received on non-attributable invaliding plus an additional attributable gratuity, if his degree of disability is 20 per cent or more, at the rates shown in Clause 7 of Schedule IX. A pensionable officer who is attributably invalided with
- A pensionable officer who is attributably invalided with A pensionable oncer who is attributably invalided with less than 2 years qualifying service may be awarded a gratuity pro rata to the 2 year rate of invaliding gratuity, but in any event at a rate less than half the 2 year rate, plus, if the degree of disability is 20 per cent or more, an additional attributable gratuity at the rates shown in Clause 7 of Schedule IX.

Terminal Grants in Addition to Retired Pay

18. An officer retired from the Active List and awarded Service Retired Pay or Service Invaliding Retired Pay under this Schedule may be awarded a terminal grant in addition to his retired pay, under the following conditions:

- (a) The standard rate of grant will be three times the annual amount of the retired pay awarded under this Schedule.
- (b) Except as provided in Clauses 2 and 6 of Schedule IV and in the case of an invaliding award being exceeded by preserved benefits an officer can qualify only once for a grant. (c) The grant will be free of income tax.

19. In the event of eligibility for full pay continuing after an officer has attained the age for retirement in his rank, list and type of commission, payment of terminal grant will only be made if an officer has reached the age of 55 years or the normal age for retirement if later if he is then still serving.

Rank for Retired Pay Purposes

20. Subject to the following Clauses, the rank for retired pay purposes shall be the substantive rank held by the officer on his retirement, provided that, unless the officer is invalided, the rank has been held on the Active List for the following minimum periods:

(a) Admiral; General, Royal Marines (b) All other officers 1 year 2 years ... ••• ...

If the substantive rank has been held for less than the period specified, the rank for retired pay purposes shall be the highest substantive rank which (with periods spent on higher substantive rank) satisfies the condition.

21. Service as Acting Captain, Royal Navy may be reckoned towards the requirement of 6 years' service as Captain irrespective of the date of substantive promotion.

Additions to Retired Pay for Service in Paid Acting Rank

22. Subject to the general conditions in Clause 23 of this Schedule, paid acting and temporary rank held by officers of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, and Women's Royal Naval Service and members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service, may reckon for increase of retired pay as follows:

(a) For each complete year (subject to a maximum of 3) for which the paid acting or temporary rank was A3

held, there may be added one-third of the difference between the retired pay for which the officer is eligible and the retired pay for which he would have been eligible had his rank for retired pay been one rank above his substantive rank.

- (b) Where an officer has previous service in a higher substantive rank which does not qualify him for the retired pay of that rank such service may reckon for retired pay as if it had been acting or temporary rank.
 (c) Parts of a year in acting or temporary rank will be calculated proportionately, provided the acting or temporary rank has been held for a minimum period of further to the service of the ser
- of i year.

General Conditions

- 23.—(a) Only paid acting or temporary rank held on or after 3rd September 1939 will count.
 (b) In no case shall service in an acting or temporary rank earn a rate of retired pay higher than would have been earned if the acting or temporary rank had been exploration. substantive.
- (c) The "complete" years referred to in Clause 22(a) of this Schedule need not be continuous in time but may be made up of broken periods.

24. The Secretary of State for Defence may fix a date after which periods in acting or temporary rank will no longer be reckonable for additions to retired pay.

Definitions of Service

25. The following periods may be included in assessing qualifying and reckonable service for the purpose of this Schedule.

- (a) Subject to Clause 27 of this Schedule, full pay service (including mobilised or embodied service or for the purpose of training) as an officer, rating or other rank of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Women's Royal Naval Service, Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nurs-Navai Service, Queen Alexandra's Koyai Navai Nurs-ing Service, the Army or the Royal Air Force (includ-ing their Women's Services) or of the Auxiliary and Reserve Forces, and of the former Armed Forces of India or Burma or of the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth or Colonies, provided that where ap-propriate such service would be reckonable as qualify-ing service under Army or Royal Air Force regula-tional there are a contended by the service there of the service there. tions; except broken periods each of less than 6 months' duration.
- (b) Periods in appointments not remunerated from Navy Votes which the Secretary of State for Defence con-siders can reasonably be regarded as part of an officer's career as such; these shall be appointments to which the officer brings his Naval knowledge and from which he acquires additional experience and which have been officilly officed to him as not of his nound corrigo.
- officially offered to him as part of his naval service. (c) Periods on half pay following the sentence of a Court Martial will reckon as a third. Loss of seniority or time forfeited by sentence of a Court Martial or a Disciplinary Court will not involve loss of service for retired pay or gratuity.

26. Except where an officer in receipt of retired pay is re-employed, service preceding a five-year interval in ser-vice shall not be included unless specially allowed by the vice shall not be included unless specially allowed by the Secretary of State for Defence, and eligibility to rackon such previous service will normally be determined at the time of resumption of service. Where, during a break in service, the officer has been a member of the Royal Naval Reserve, or other reserve of any of the Forces, undertaking or liable for periodical training, the period of such mem-bership will not be considered an interval in service for the purpose of deciding whether the previous service is admissible.

Previous Service for which a Non-effective Award has been Received

- 27.-(a) In the case of previous service in respect of which the officer received a service gratuity, or in any case of previous service other than in the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Army, or the Royal Air Force, it may be stipulated as a condition for allowing such service to reckon for retired pay, that the officer shall make a payment to Navy Funds, either in a lump sum or otherwise. In default of such payment as may have been stipulated the previous service will not be reckonable for the purposes of a non-effective award.
- (b) If an officer has continued to draw concurrently with full pay the retired pay or other analogous award pay-able in respect of previous service, the further service

will normally not confer eligibility for improved benefits on final termination of employment, except where the provisions of Clause 1 of Schedule IV apply.

Counting of Service

- 28.—(a) Reckonable Service. All service as defined above from the age of 21 years will count in full as reckon-
- (b) Qualifying Service. All service as defined above from the age of 18 years will count in full as qualifying
- (c) "Completed years of service" "years of qualifying service" and "years of reckonable service" mean full pay service up to and including the last day on full pay.

Special Rules relating to Officers promoted from the Ranks

29.-(a) Permanent Commission. A rating promoted to a lar engagement may on retirement be granted either: (i) Retired pay under the conditions set out in this Schedule, or

(ii) Retired pay under the current rules for the award of ratings' pensions; whichever is more to his advantage

(b) Temporary Commission. A rating promoted to a temporary commission on the Special Duties List will be eligible only for a rating's pension unless he completes 7 or more years of commissioned service when he may be awarded retired pay under the conditions set out in this Section if more favourable than a rating's pension. An officer who retires at his own request may be awarded additions for commissioned service in accordance with Clause 13 of Schedule II subject to the total award not exceeding the amount which would have been payable had the officer been a permanent Special Duties List Officer.

Retirement for Incapacity, Unsuitability or Inefficiency

- 30.-(a) Not within an officer's control. An officer who
- 30.—(a) Not within an officer's control. An officer who is retired for incapacity, unsuitability or for inefficiency not due to causes within his own control, and having at least 16 years' reckonable service, may be granted retired pay as for a compulsory retirement on account of non-employment.
 (b) Within an Officer's control. An officer who is retired for incapacity or inefficiency due to causes within his own control, but not amounting to misconduct, and having at least 16 year's reckonable service, may be granted an award of retired pay at such rate as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine, but not in any event exceeding the rate which would have been admissible had he retired voluntarily.

Section II

Half Pay and Terminal Grants for Admirals of the Fleet

31. An Admiral of the Fleet will be eligible, during periods for which he does not receive full pay, for half pay as specified in Clause 2 of Schedule IX.

32. An Admiral of the Fleet on completion of active service may, on being placed on half pay, be awarded a tax-free terminal grant of three times the rate of that half-pay. He shall not, however, be eligible for any further ter-minal grant on the conclusion of any subsequent period of full pay service.

Section III

Gratuities for Pensionable Officers

33. Officers serving on permanent or pensionable com-missions (other than those on the Special Duties List) may, if they are retired on account of incapacity, unsuitability or inefficiency not due to causes within their control with at least 2 years' qualifying service, but with insufficient service to qualify for a preserved pension, be awarded a gratuity of such amount as the Secretary of State may determine but not in any event exceeding £390 (£372 for female officers) for the first two years service given before 6th April 1978, with additions at the rate of £390 (£372 for female officers) for each subsequent year of service given before 6th April 1978.

Gratuities for Supplementary List Aircrew Serving On Pensionable Commissions

34. Officers serving on Type B 16/38 pensionable com-missions who exercise their options to leave the service

at their 8 or 12 year breakpoints which occur on or after 6th April 1978 will be entitled to either:

- (a) a preserved pension and tax free preserved terminal grant based on reckonable service from 6th April 1978 plus an immediate tax-free gratuity as specified in Clause 6 of Schedule XI; or

In either case those officers who have completed at least 9 years' reckonable service may be awarded an immediate tax-free resettlement grant.

35. Officers who leave at any time other than at their optional breakpoints will have any award of retired pay or preserved benefits assessed in accordance with Section 1 of this Schedule and with Schedule III.

SCHEDULE II

Section I

1. The provisions of this Schedule relate to ratings of the Royal Navy, other ranks of the Royal Marines, Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service and ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Service who give service on full pay on or after 31st March 1979. They do not apply to RN locally entered ratings. Eligibility to receive an award under earlier regulations is hereby extinguished.

. Except where otherwise stated, the term 'ratings' in this Schedule should be read as including Non-Commis-sioned Officers, Fleet Chief Petty Officers, Chief Petty Officers, Petty Officers, ratings and other ranks of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines and the Women's Royal Naval Service and Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service Naval Nursing Service.

Conditions of Award

3. A service pension and terminal grant assessed as in Clauses 11 to 15 of this Schedule may be awarded to:

- (a) A rating who is discharged having completed at least 22 years' reckonable service.
-) A rating who is invalided provided he has com-pleted at least 5 years' reckonable service, and subject to the provisions of Section II of this Schedule. (b) A

4. A rating who is discharged not more than 91 days before completing 22 years reckonable service so that he may enter civil employment which he has obtained, or to arke up a full-time guaranteed place in a university, college or comparable establishment, may be awarded a service pension and terminal grant calculated on the actual reck-onable service he has rendered, provided that the employ-ment or education cannot be held open until his due date of discharge and the reckonable service is not less than 21 years 274 days.

5. Subject to Clause 15 of this Schedule pensions may be awarded at the rates set out in Clauses 8 and 9 of Schedule IX to United Kingdom ratings discharged from service on or after 31st March 1979.

Terminal Grant

6. A terminal grant in addition to service pension or service invaliding pension will be payable at a rate equal to three times the annual value of any pension awarded. Where an addition in respect of a gallantry award is made to a pension under the provisions of Order in Council of 14th October 1947, such addition shall be omitted for the purpose of assessing the terminal grant.

Reckonable Service

7. Reckonable service for the purpose of determining entitlement to service pension will, subject to Clauses 8 to 10 of this Schedule, be as follows:

- (a) Unforfeited full pay service given, otherwise than as a commissioned officer, after attaining the age of 18 years, in the Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Army, the Royal Air Force, or in the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth or Colonies, or in the former Armed Forces of India or Burma, including their associated Women's Services.
 (b) Service as a commissioned officer which would reckon
- their associated women's services.
 (b) Service as a commissioned officer which would reckon under Clauses 25 to 26 of Schedule I.
 (c) Periods on full pay for the purposes of training while a member of the Auxiliary or Reserve Forces, except broken periods individually of less than six months' duration.

- (d) Whilst a regular rating, periods in appointments not remunerated from Navy Funds which the Secretary of remunerated from Navy Funds which the Secretary of State for Defence may decide can reasonably be regarded as part of the rating's career as such. These will generally be appointments to which the rating brings his Naval knowledge and from which he acquires additional experience and which have been offered to him as part of his Naval service. (e) Full time employment with the Navy, Army or Air Force as a member of a Voluntary Aid Detachment.

8. The following shall not be reckonable service for the purposes of this Schedule:

- (a) Periods of imprisonment or detention, whether awarded summarily or by sentence of a Court Martial; or confinement in cells.
- (b) Time forfeited through conviction by the Civil Power; or consequent upon an Order made under any Act relating to the Probation of Offenders.
 (c) Time spent in desertion and at the discretion of the
- Secretary of State for Defence any service preceding desertion.
- (d) Any service during which pension is drawn except as provided in sections IV, V and VI of Schedule IV.
 (e) Service rendered by any person who shall have re-entered after having been dismissed from Her Majesty's Service with disgrace or discharge with ignominy unless allowed by the Secretary of State for Defence.
- -(a) In the case of previous service in respect of which the rating received a service gratuity (including a gratuity in respect of supplemental or extended service), it shall be a condition of allowing such service as reckonable service under Clause 7 of this Schedule that the gratuity shall be refunded either in a lump sum or otherwise.
- sum or otherwise. (b) In any case of previous service other than in the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Army or Royal Air Force, it may be stipulated as a condition for the allowing of such service towards pension or gratuity that the person makes a payment in respect of previous excess remuneration received to Navy Funds, either in a lump sum or otherwise of such amount as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine.

10. Except where a rating in receipt of a service pension is re-employed, service preceding a five-year interval in service will not be reckonable unless specially so allowed by the Secretary of State for Defence, and eligibility to reckon such service will normally be determined at the time of resumption of service. However, the following periods will not be regarded as intervals in service for the purpose:

- (a) A period during which a man was a member of a Reserve Force undertaking, or liable for, periodical training.
- (b) A period during which a man, although not a member of an organised reserve, remained liable for recall, provided his period of service included a period of war service. War service for this purpose is defined as full pay service between 3rd September 1939 and 15th August 1946.
-) A period during which a man was serving in the Navy of a member of the Commonwealth. (c)

Assessment of Pension

11. Except as provided in Clauses 16 and 19 of this Schedule, pension will be based on the length of reckonable scrucice and on the highest paid rank, whether acting or confirmed, held for an aggregate period of 2 years or more during the 5 years' reckonable service preceding discharge to pension. Where during his final 5 years of service a rating has completed less than 2 years but at least one year in his highest paid rank his pension will be assessed on the paid rank which he has held for an aggregate period of 2 years or more with an addition of one-third of the difference, between the rate for that rank and the rate for difference between the rate for that rank and the rate for the next higher rank for each year (subject to a maximum of 2 years) served in a rank or ranks higher than that on which pension is based. Where more than two ranks have been held during the last 5 years of service and the required 2 years has not been served in any one rank, paid service in a higher rank may, where it is to a rating's advantage, be treated as if it were in all respects service in a lower rank. The addition to pension will be calculated by reference to years and days of service rather than to completed years. In the case of those invalided, pension may be based on the length of reckonable service and on the acting A4

confirmed rank held at the time of discharge provided the higher rank was a regular roster advancement, if this is more favourable.

Addition for Aircrew Service

12. Ratings who have given or are giving service which under regulations in force prior to 1st April 1972, would give them title to an addition to pension in respect of air-crew service and who, on or before 1st June 1972, engaged to serve for longer than 12 years will be eligible for an addition to their pension shown below in respect of their total aircrew service at the time of discharge at the rates applicable on 31st March 1972 subject to the total pension not exceeding the following limits:

Pension Limit

50 per cent of the highest banded rate of military salary, plus Long Service Pay, appropriate to the rank on which the pension is assessed.

Pension Addition

(b) Air Quartermasters £0.06 a week for each year of aircrew service.

Pension Limit

50 per cent of the second highest banded rate of military salary, plus Long Service Pay, appropriate to the rank on which the pension is assessed. Where the rating is also eligible for additions in respect of com-missioned service the limit on total pension will be the higher of the two applicable limits.

Addition for Commissioned Service

13. Where a rating had previous commissioned service and has been awarded a service pension under the pro-visions of Clauses 11 and 16 of this Schedule, an addition may be made to that pension as specified in Clause 8 of Schedule IX subject to a maximum of 9 years' such service. These additions will not be payable to officers with pre-vious article service are as officers on pensionable vious rating service who retire as officers on pensionable commissions (as opposed to temporary commissions of less than 7 years duration) and opt for a rating's pension.

Previous Service as a Maltese locally enlisted Other Rank or Airman

14. Previous service as a Maltese locally enlisted other rank or airman which is otherwise reckonable for pension purposes may be added to reckonable naval service for the award of a service pension and terminal grant. The pension and terminal grant will be assessed at the current rate appropriate for each period of service, but assessed for both periods at the rank determined under Clauses 11 and 16 of this Schedule.

Maximum Rates of Pension

15. Ratings who were entitled under the terms of DCI (RN) 1104/64 who continue to serve beyond 37 years will receive an addition to the 37 year rate of pension equal to 1/37 of the appropriate 37 year rate of pension for each year of reckonable service beyond 37 years subject to a maximum of 5 years, i.e. 5/37 of the 37 year rate of pension.

Extended Service

16. Where a rating has completed a pensionable engage-ment before the age of 55 years but is permitted to remain in the Service in a lower rank, he may on final discharge be awarded the pension for which he would have been eligible had he been discharged on the date on which he reverted to the lower rank (but calculated at the rates engible had he been discharged on the date on which he reverted to the lower rank (but calculated at the rates current on the date on which he is actually discharged). He will also be eligible to receive a yearly increment in respect of the period of additional service (calculated in accordance with the rates current at the time of his final discharge), equal to the difference between the rate of pension for equal to the difference between the rate of pension for the lower rank payable for a period equal to his total period of service and that payable for a period equal to that served in the higher rank. Unless it would be more advan-tageous to apply the provisions of Clause 13 of Schedule IV this increment for a rating who is re-employed as de-fined in Clause 12 of that Schedule will be calculated in recording a unstated of participation and the time accordance with the rates of pension current at the time of final discharge or at the time of original discharge

whichever is the more advantageous taking into account, where appropriate, the effect of pensions increase measures.

17. A rating whose eligibility for full pay continues after he attains the age of 55 years may be paid the terminal grant for which his service up to that age has qualified him. Such service beyond the age of 55 years will be treated as if re-employed service under the provisions of DCI(RN) 768/79 for the payment of part pension and re-assessment of pension and terminal grant on final discharge with the 55th birthday being deemed to be the date of the earlier discharge. earlier discharge.

Section II

Service Invaliding Pension

18. Ratings who are non-attributably invalided on or after the 1st April 1979 and who have completed at least 5 years' reckonable service may be awarded Service Invaliding Pension at the rates shown in Clause 9 of Schedule IX.

19. Where, however, a rating is invalided in his last year of service or where in the view of the Discretionary Awards Panel the circumstances of the case justify it, a lesser award may be made than that shown in Clause 9 of Schedule IX.

20. Where it would be more favourable to the rating, service invaliding pension will be re-assessed at the age of 60 years under the terms for preserved pensions in Section II. In such a case a preserved terminal grant will also be awarded at the age of 60 years, the amount of which will be three times the difference between the original rate of preserved pension, uplifted by the appropriate pen-sions increase measures in force before the rating's 60th birthday.

21. Ratings who are non-attributably invalided on or after 31st March 1979 with less than 5 years' reckonable service but with not less than 2 years' may be awarded a gratuity at the rates shown in Clause II of Schedule IX.

22. Reckonable service for the purposes of this section will be as for service pension in Clauses 6 to 10 of this Schedule.

23. Notwithstanding the provisions of this Schedule the award and amount of any Service Invaliding Pension or Gratuity shall be at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence.

Section III

Service Attributable Pension

Service Attributable Pension 24. Irrespective of their length of service all ratings who are invalided with a degree of disability assessed as 20 per cent or more may be awarded Service Attributable Pension provided their disability is accepted by the Department of Health and Social Security as being attributable to or aggravated by service. The rank upon which the award is based will be determined in the same way as for Service Invaliding Pension. The award of Service Attributable Pension will be at the appropriate rate of Service Invaliding Pension in respect of the rating's service unless this be less favourable than the minimum rate as shown in Clause 10 of Schedule IX in which case the latter will apply. In either case the award will be tax-free. Eligibility to receive an award of Service Attributable Pension shall extend in time of general mobilisation or imminent national danger or award of Service Attributable Pension shall extend in time of general mobilisation or imminent national danger or emergency to ratings of the Royal Naval Reserve, other ranks of the Royal Marines Reserve, Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service Reserve and ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Reserve but not to Rating Instructors of the Sea Cadet Corps other than those who are members of a reserve force specified above.

25. This award may be paid concurrently with any dis-ablement pension or other Department of Health and Social Security allowances except that Service Attributable Pension will be abated by the amount of any Unemploy-bility for the service of the service attributed by the service attribute of ability Supplement put into payment by the Department of Health and Social Security within 12 months of their determination of attributability provided the amount abated shall not exceed the excess of the minimum rate set out in Clause 10 of Schedule IX over the appropriate rate of Service Invaliding Pension.

26. Should the degree of disability increase at any time the rate of Service Attributable Pension will be reviewed. If the degree of disability decreases however, attributable pension will only be reviewed during the 12 months imme-diately following discharge unless the degree of disability falls below 20 per cent in which case it will be abated

whenever that occurs by the difference between the mini-mum rate and the appropriate rate of Service Invaliding Pension.

27. Where the rate of Service Attributable Pension is reviewed the revised rate will be that appropriate to the revised degree of disability, at the rate current at the date of invaliding, enhanced where applicable by relevant pension increase measures.

28. An adjustment to the excess of the minimum rate over the appropriate rate of Service Invaliding Pension may be made in cases where a rating recovers damages for an injury which led to the attributable invaliding.

29. The excess of the minimum rate over the appropriate rate of Service Invaliding Pension is not commutable.

30. In addition to any award of attributable pension under Clause 24 of this Schedule any rating invalided from attributable cause may be awarded either:

- (a) The terminal grant, if any, for which he would have been eligible on non-attributable invaliding plus an additional attributable gratuity if his degree of disa-bility is 20 per cent or more at the rates shown in Clause 12 of Schedule 1X; or (b) The gratuity which he would have received on non-
- (b) The gratuity which he would have received on nonb) the gratuity which he would have received on non-attributable invaliding except that a rating with less than 2 years' qualifying service, including a rating with less than 20 per cent disability, may receive not less than half the 2 year rate of invaliding gratuity, plus an additional attributable gratuity, if his degree of disa-bility is 20 per cent or more at the rates shown in Clause 12 of Schedule IX.

SCHEDULE III

Section I

Preserved Pensions and Terminal Grants

1. The provisions of this Schedule relate to officers and ratings who gave service on or after 31st March 1975 and who were retired or discharged without eligibility for immediate retired pay or pension.

diate retired pay or pension. 2. In this Schedule the term "retired pay or pension" includes service retired pay and pension; service invaliding retired pay and pension; and Service attributable retired pay and pension. The term "officer" includes officers of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service and Women's Royal Naval Service. The term "rating" includes Non-Commissioned Officers, Fleet Chief Petty Officers, Chief Petty Officers, Petty Officers, ratings and other ranks of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines and the Women's Royal Naval Service and Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service. 3. The rate of preserved pension will be:

3. The rate of preserved pension will be:

(a) Officers—except Chaplains: for each year of reckon-able service (from the age of 21 years) 3 per cent of the 34 year rate of service retired pay appropriate to the rank or ranks for service retired pay purposes.

(b) Chaplains

(i) with less than 10 years' reckonable service: for each year of reckonable service 3 per cent of the 34 year rate of the service retired pay of a Lieutenant ŘΝ

(ii) with 10 or more years' reckonable service: for each year of reckonable service 3 per cent of the 34 year rate of the service retired pay of a Lieutenant Commander RN.

(c) RN Ratings and Other Ranks RM: for each year of reckonable service (from the age of 18 years), 2.75 per cent of the 37 year rate of service pension appropriate to the rank or ranks for service pension purposes.

Preserved terminal grant at three times the annual value of preserved pension will also be paid.

4. The preserved pension and terminal grant will nor-mally be paid when the officer, rating or other rank attains the age of 60 years, though payment may be made earlier if the pensioner becomes permanently incapable of working through physical or mental infirmity. The preserved pen-sion, when paid, will be adjusted in accordance with such pensions increase measures as are applicable at the time of payment and the preserved terminal grant will be similarly adjusted.

5. Forfeiture or abatement of preserved pension may be made in certain cases but always subject to the provisions of Section II of this Schedule.

6. A preserved pension will not be commutable in any circumstances.

Former Service

7. Where a preserved pension and terminal grant have been awarded for former service and the officer or rating enters within 6 months of release, the preserved pension and terminal grant will be cancelled, so that on final retirement the aggregate of former service and re-employed service will be assessed under the provisions of the Order in Council current at the time of final release.

8. If re-entry takes place after more than 6 months but within 5 years of the date of release from former service, an officer or rating awarded preserved benefits for such service, has the option of either aggregating the two periods of service for one pension or of receiving two separate pensions. This option may be exercised:

- (a) immediately on re-employment if the preserved pension is already in payment; or(b) if the pension is not in payment at the time, when
- (b) if the pension is not in payment at the time, when the pension is due to come into payment, or if earlier, when re-employment ceases.

Section II

Abatement, Forfeiture and Restoration of Retired Pay and Pensions

9. An officer or rating who is retired or discharged for incapacity or inefficiency due to causes within his own control or for misconduct, and is otherwise eligible for an award of immediate retired pay or pension and terminal grant under Schedule I or II may be granted that award at such reduced rate as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine. In the case of officers the award shall not exceed the rate which would have been admissible had he retired voluntarily, and in the case of ratings shall not exceed 90 per cent. of the award which would have been admissible had the discharge been on other grounds.

10. Where a rating has been discharged for misconduct, or has been disrated for misconduct or reverted for inefficiency or unsuitability during the 5 years preceding termination of full pay service and is otherwise eligible for a service pension under Clause 3 of Schedule II, the rank on which such pension is based will be determined by the Secretary of State for Defence having regard to the circumstances of the case.

Dismissal

11. An officer with at least 16 years' reckonable service who is dismissed the Service or dismissed with disgrace by sentence of a Court Martial or whose name has been removed from the List of Officers or who has been allowed to resign his commission to avoid trial by Court Martial may be granted a compassionate allowance at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence but not in any event exceeding the rate of retired pay which would have been admissible had he retired at his own request. In addition to this allowance the Secretary of State may, at his discretion, grant a compassionate gratuity not exceeding three times the amount of the allowance.

Grave Offences

12. For certain grave offences against the State or against military discipline as defined in Clause 14 of the Schedule to Order in Council $\frac{9^*}{NPP}$ of 25th July 1978, forfeiture or abatement of immediate or preserved pension benefits may be imposed without right of restoration at any age. In such cases, the widow's benefits may also be abated or forfeited where in the opinion of the Secretary of State for Defence she was an accessory to, or profited by, the offence.

Serious Offences

13. For serious offences against the State or against military discipline abatement or forfeiture may be imposed subject to there being, at the age of 60 years, restoration of at least the minimum benefits required by Order in Council $\frac{9^*}{\text{NPP}}$ dated 25th July 1978 and also, from the age of 65 years for men and 60 years for women, sufficient retired pay or pension to equal the amount of the Guaranteed Minimum Pension required by that Order in Council. For the purpose of this Section a compassionate allowance awarded under Clause 11 above shall be treated as though it were a reduced award of retired pay.

14. In the case of all other offences where retired pay or pension has been suspended or abated, the award will be restored at the age of 60 years to the level of a pension and terminal grant calculated in accordance with the provisions of Clause 3 of this Schedule. 15. Any half pay, retired pay, pension or terminal grant payable under Schedules I and II to this Order in Council may, subject to any restrictions imposed by Order in Council $\frac{9^*}{\text{NPP}}$ dated 25th July 1978, be abated at the discretion of the Secretary of State to meet any public or service debt, including mess debts, long service advance of pay, judgment debts to the Crown, or any debt to Service charitable or benevolent funds.

16. Any restoration of retired pay or pension will attract pension increases and a corresponding re-assessment and payment of the balance of terminal grant, calculated at three times the difference between the restored rate of retired pay or pension and the abated award as increased by the appropriate pensions increase measures.

17. Officers who retire at their own request and who incur an abatement of their immediate retired pay will, on attaining the age of 60 years, and where it is to their advantage, have their retired pay and terminal grant reassessed using the accrual rates set out in Clause 3 of this Schedule. Pension increases will be applied to any such re-assessment.

18. No abatement for premature voluntary retirement will be taken into account when assessing an award of preserved pension and terminal grant.

SCHEDULE IV

Section I

Retired Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines Re-employed in Peacetime

1. Except as provided in section III of this Schedule an officer who is in receipt of any form of retired pay may, while re-employed for training or for any authorised Naval duty for periods not exceeding 6 consecutive months, or aggregating 6 months or less in any 12 months, continue to draw his retired pay concurrently with any pay to which he is entitled; but payment of retired pay may be suspended when there is doubt about the duration of the period of re-employment. Except where re-employed service is in a rank lower than the substantive rank held at first retirement no form of retired pay will be payable when the period of re-employment exceeds 6 months. Where an officer is reemployed in a rank lower than his substantive rank held at first retirement such portion of his retired pay may continue to be paid from the age of 55 years or normal age for retirement if later, for such time as he continues to serve in a lower rank, which when added to the pay of his lower rank immediately on re-employment or on attaining the age of 55 years or normal age for retirement whichever is the latest, equals the pay he was receiving in the higher rank uprated by the same pensions increases for which his retired pay is eligible. Subsequent increases in pay rates or in the pensions increases payable will not lead to a re-assessment of the portion of retired pay continuing in payment, but a change in the rank in which the officer is serving will lead to such a re-assessment.

2. An officer in receipt of retired pay who has been re-employed and whose retired pay has been suspended in whole or in part under Clause 1 of this Schedule may on final retirement be awarded re-assessed retired pay and terminal grant under either of the following sub-Clauses whichever is to his advantage and in this respect pension and terminal grant is at the officer's own request before the completion of 3 years re-employment service, re-assessment of his retired pay and terminal grant will be in accordance only with the provisions of sub-Clause (b) of this Clause.

- (a) the retired pay code in force at the time of his final retirement assessed on his rank for pension purposes at final retirement and on the total of his re-employed and former reckonable service subject to a maximum of 34 years;
- (b) the provisions of the pension code under which he originally retired in respect of his rank for pension purposes at the date of the earlier retirement and of his total reckonable service up to a maximum of 34 years including the re-employed service.

Where the award to an officer who finally retired before the age 55 years ceases to be the more advantageous on his becoming eligible for pensions increases, then the more advantageous award may be substituted for the original award with effect from the date from which payment of the pensions increases is effective. The balance of terminal grant payable will be the difference between a terminal grant calculated in accordance with either sub-Clause (a) or (b) of this Clause and the Terminal Grant previously paid. Where the balance is calculated by reference to sub-Clause (b) of this Clause, it will be increased by the Pensions Increases applicable to the code in force on original retirement.

3. A re-employed officer who was formerly retired with service invaliding or attributable retired pay and who has such retired pay suspended in whole or in part under Clause 1 of this schedule, may on final retirement be awarded either retired pay under the provisions of sub-Clause 2(a) of this Schedule or have his former award of service invaliding or attributable retired pay restored in full with no account taken of the re-employed service, whichever is to his advantage. Where on final retirement the former award of service invaliding or attributable retired pay is the more advantageous, but ceases to be at the officer's 55th birthday when pensions increases would become payable on the alternative award, then the latter may be substituted for the original award with effect from the date from which payment of the pensions increase is effective.

4. Where an officer who has commuted a part of his retired pay is re-employed and his retired pay is suspended under Clause 1 of this Schedule a reduction equal to the annual amount of retired pay commuted will be made in his annual salary. A deduction equivalent to the amount of the original part of the retired pay commuted will, unless the commutation was effected under the resettlement scheme and the officer is aged 55 years or over on final retirement, but the commutation will be ignored in assessing the final terminal grant which will be based on the gross retired pay irrespective of commutation.

5. If the officer had originally retired at his own request, re-assessed retired pay and terminal grant under Clause 2 of this Schedule will be on the basis of voluntary retirement, unless he is invalided from re-employment.

6. An officer re-employed before his 55th birthday who has already received a terminal grant on original retirement may be awarded on his 55th birthday or the normal age for retirement in his rank if later the balance of any terminal grant due at that time. Where this option is taken the date of earlier retirement for the purposes of reassessment or retired pay and terminal grant on final retirement will be the date on which the balance of terminal grant became payable.

7. An officer who re-enters the Service within 5 years of being discharged on redundancy will be required to refund a portion of the Special Capital Payment awarded to him. The refund will be calculated as follows:

$\frac{a-b}{c}$ × The Special Capital Payment

("a" representing 5 years or the uncompleted period of service on redundancy, whichever is the less, and "b" the break in service. In cases of "b" being greater than "a" there is no refund).

Section II

Retired Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines employed by the Ministry of Defence

8. Where a retired officer in receipt of retired pay is employed by the Ministry of Defence as a Principal Retired Officer or Retired Officer Grade I, II or III his retired pay will be abated in accordance with the provisions of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Retired Officers' Abatement) Order 1975.

9. An officer taking up a Retired Officer post within two years of redundancy may be required to refund a portion of the Special Capital Payment awarded to him, in accordance with Section I or Schedule VII

Section III

Retired Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines: re-employment in Emergency

10. On recall for service at a time of imminent national danger or of great emergency, or when re-employment with the Armed Forces on general mobilisation, one-half of the retired pay of a retired officer will remain in issue concurrently with the pay and allowances appropriate to his rank or re-employment. Any portion of the retired pay that has been commuted will be recovered from his pay to the extent of the deficiency.

11. For the purpose of applying the provisions of Clause 10 of this Schedule to a retired officer compulsorily recalled at a time of national emergency when general mobilisation has not been announced, the operative period will be determined by the Secretary of State for Defence in consultation with the Minister for the Civil Service.

Section IV

Service Pensioners re-employed in Peacetime

12. A rating who is in receipt of any form of service pension may, while re-employed for training or for any authorised Naval duty for periods not exceeding 6 consecutive months, or aggregating 6 months or less in any 12 months, continue to draw his pension concurrently with any pay to which he is entitled; but payment of pension may be suspended when there is doubt about the duration of the period of re-employment. Except where re-employed service is in a rank lower than the substantive rank held at first discharge no form of pension will be payable when the period of re-employment exceeds six months. Where a rating is re-employed in a rank lower than his substantive rank held at first discharge such portion of his pension may continue to be paid from age 55 years onwards for such time as he continues to serve in a lower rank, which when added to the pay of his lower rank immediately on re-employment or on attaining the age of 55 years, equals the pay he was receiving in the higher rank uprated by the same pensions increases for which his pension is eligible. Subsequent increases in pay rates or in the pensions increases payable will not lead to re-assessment of the portion of pension continuing in payment, but a change in the rank in which the rating is serving will lead to such a re-assessment.

13. A rating in receipt of service pension who has been re-employed and whose pension has been suspended in whole or in part under Clause 12 of this Schedule may on final discharge to pension be awarded re-assessed pension and terminal grant under either of the following sub-clauses of this Clause or under Clause 16 of Schedule 2 which-ever is to his advantage. Where re-assessment is under this Clause pension and terminal grant may be re-assessed under different sub-Clauses. If however, final discharge is at the rating's own request before the completion of 3 years re-employed service, re-assessment of his pension and terminal grant will be in accordance only with the provisions of sub-Clause (b) of this Clause.

(a) the pension code in force at the time of his final discharge assessed on his rank for pension purposes at final discharge and on the total of his re-employed and former reckonable service subject to a maximum of 37 years;

(b) the provisions of the pension code under which he was originally discharged in respect of his rank for pension purposes at the date of the earlier discharge and of his total reckonable service up to a maximum of 37 years including the re-employed service.

Where the award to a rating who was finally discharged before the age of 55 years ceases to be the more advantageous on his becoming eligible for pensions increases, then the more advantageous award may be substituted for the original award with effect from the date from which payment of the pensions increases is effective. The balance of terminal grant payable will be the difference between a terminal grant calculated in accordance with either sub-Clause (a) or (b) of this Clause and the Terminal Grant previously paid. Where the balance is calculated by reference to sub-Clause (b) of this Clause it will be increased by the Pensions Increases applicable to the code in force on original discharge.

14. A re-employed rating who was formerly discharged with service invaliding or attributable pension and who has had such pension suspended in whole or in part under Clause 12 of this Schedule, may on final discharge be awarded either service pension under the provisions of Clause 13 of this Schedule or have his former award of service invaliding or attributable pension restored in full with no account taken of the re-employed service, whichever is to his advantage. Where on final discharge the former award of service invaliding or attributable pension is the more advantageous, but ceases to be at the rating's 55th birthday when pensions increases would become payable on the alternative award, then the latter may be substituted for the original award with effect from the date from which payment of the pensions increases is effective.

15. Where a rating who commuted a part of his pension is re-employed and has his pension suspended in whole or in part under Clause 12 of this Schedule, a reduction equal to the annual amount of the pension commuted will be made from his pay. A deduction equivalent to the amount of the original part of the pension commuted will, unless the commutation was effected under the resettlement scheme and the rating is aged 55 years or over on final discharge, be made from the revised award made on final discharge, but the commutation will be ignored in assess-ing the final terminal grant which will be based on the gross pension irrespective of commutation. pension irrespective of commutation.

16. An officer who after being awarded retired pay is subsequently re-employed as an RN rating or Royal Marine other rank, may be dealt with under this Section as if his retired pay were a service pension.

17. A rating re-employed before the age of 55 years who has already received a terminal grant on original diswho has already received a terminal grant on original dis-charge may be awarded on his 55th birthday the balance of any terminal grant due at that time. Where this option is taken, the date of earlier discharge for the purposes of re-assessment of pension and terminal grant on final discharge will be the date on which the balance of terminal grant became payable.

18. A rating who re-enters the Service within 5 years of being discharged on redundancy will be required to refund a portion of the Special Capital Payment awarded to him. The refund will be calculated as follows:

$\frac{a-b}{a}$ × The Special Capital Payment

("a" representing 5 years or the uncompleted period of service on redundancy, whichever is the less, and "b" the break in service. In cases of "b" being greater than "a" there is no refund.)

Section V

Future Emergency Re-employment of Service Pensioners 19. This Section relates to:

- (a) service pensioners recalled for service during a period of general recall;
- (b) other service pensioners who give further service otherwise than on normal or non-continuous service engagements) during a period of general recall to service on account of an emergency, or who are specially re-employed on full pay in anticipation of an imminent general recall.

20. The provisions of this Section may be brought into operation for such pensioners on such occasions and for such periods as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine, in consultation with the Minister for the Civil Service.

21. A service pensioner will, during periods of further service to which these provisions apply, continue to receive his service pension subject to the conditions normally attached thereto.

22. On discharge or release from such service a service pensioner, provided his service has been satisfactory and of at least 6 months' duration, may receive an addition to his pension of half the difference between:

- (a) the pension for which his previous service qualified him, or would have qualified him under Section 1 of Schedule II; and
- (b) the pension for which he would be eligible under Section 1 of Schedule II if his further service were added to his previous service.

23. No terminal grant or additional terminal grant will be payable in respect of the re-employment.

24. An addition under Clause 22 of this Schedule may be granted although the existing pension was assessed under regulations in force before 1st April 1979.

25. If service pensioners are employed with the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth or Colonies, the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence as if their further service had been with the Royal Navy, Royal Marines or Women's Royal Naval Service.

Section VI

Ratings serving on regular engagements continuing in service during a future Emergency

26. The following Clause will be brought into operation on such occasions, being periods of general recall to service on account of emergency as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine, in consultation with the Minister

for the Civil Defence. In respect of each such occasion the Secretary of State for Defence may fix a date from which it will come into operation and after which it will cease to apply.

rating serving on a normal regular engagement 27. A rating serving on a normal regular engagement while this Clause is in operation, who completes 22 years' service reckonable for pension under Schedule II may be allowed, with effect from the date of completion of 22 years' service, to receive an immediate award of service pension and terminal grant, calculated on 22 years' service. If he elects to receive pension while serving he will there-after be regarded for pension purposes as a re-employed pensioner under Section V of this Schedule.

SCHEDULE V

Abatement from service retired pay and service pension in relation to retirement pension under the National Insurance Act 1946 (1946 c. 67) and the National Insurance Act 1965 (1965 c. 51).

1. The provisions of this Schedule relate to officers of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service and the Women's Royal Naval Ser-vice; ratings of the Royal Navy and other ranks of the Royal Marines and Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service, and ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Service who:

(a) entered the service on or after 1st July 1949; or
(b) re-entered the service, after a break in service, on or after 1st July 1949; except those who re-entered within 12 months of being invalided or those who had already been granted service retired pay or service pension before re-entry.

Any rating or other rank, the regular part of whose engage-ment terminated before 1st July 1949, but who continued to serve on the reserve portion of that regular engagement shall, if he rejoined the service on a regular engagement before the termination of the reserve portion of his previous regular engagement, be regarded as having continuous regular service for the purposes of this Clause.

2. The Secretary of State for Defence may exempt from the provisions of this Schedule any officer, rating or other rank, who entered or re-entered the Royal Navy after 30th June 1949, if satisfied that such entry or re-entry was in fulfilment of an undertaking or commitment entered into before 1st July 1949.

. Except as provided in Clause 4 of this Schedule, service 5. Except as provided in Clause 4 of this Schedule, service retired pay or service pension shall be reduced by £0.01667 a week for each complete year of reckonable service subject to a maximum of £0.80 a week, on becoming eligible for a National Retirement Pension on attaining the age of 65 years, in the case of men, or on attaining the age of 60 years in the case of women.

4. No abatement, however, shall be made in the case of a person permanently resident outside the United Kingdom unless that person is receiving retirement pension under the National Insurance Act 1946, or a corresponding award payable under reciprocal arrangements with the country of domicile.

5. Subject to Clause 6 below service retired pay or service 5. Subject to Clause 6 below service retired pay or service pension shall also be reduced to take account of graduated national insurance pensions. The reduction will apply from the age of 65 years for men and from the age of 60 years for women. An officer or rating who, for a part of his reckonable service, was not contracted out of the Graduated Pension Scheme will have his retired pay or pension reduced by the amount of pension earned by graduated contribu-tions payable under the National Insurance Act 1965 that is by contributions of:

(a) 44 per cent of earnings between £9 and £15 a week from 3rd April 1961 to 31st May 1963;
(b) 44 per cent of earnings between £9 and £18 a week, from 1st June 1963 to 5th April 1975;

except that there will be no reduction if the graduated pension earned by these contributions is £5.20 a year or less.

6. There will be no reduction for graduated pension earned by contributions paid during service contracted out of the Graduated Pension Scheme, or in respect of gradu-ated contributions which were in addition to those payable under the National Insurance Act 1965.

SCHEDULE VI

Transfer of Pension Rights

1. The provisions of this Schedule apply to officers of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service and Women's Royal Naval Service; ratings of the Royal Navy, other ranks of the Royal Marines, Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Service and ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Service who gave service on and after 31st March 1975 and left the service without title to immediate retired pay or pension. Subject to the general conditions set out below and also to such regulations as are agreed by the Civil Service Department for the conduct of the public sector transfer network such officers, ratings or other ranks may apply to have their pension rights transferred to the scheme they join on leaving the Service. Similarly officers, ratings or other ranks who join the service after having accumulated pension rights in their previous employment may apply to their previous pension scheme to have those rights transferred into the Armed Forces Pension Scheme.

2. The minimum qualifying period for the payment of a transfer value is one year of reckonable or contracted-out service, that is, service from any age on or after 6th April 1978 during which the lower, contracted-out rate of National Insurance contribution is paid.

3. A transfer value will not normally be paid after a break between two pensionable employments of more than 12 months or if the application for it is made more than 6 months after the transferee joins his new scheme.

4. Transfer values for those leaving the Service will be calculated using age at the time of leaving and preserved benefits under the provisions of Schedule III above, with the exception that there will be no minimum qualifying period of service other than the one year referred to in Clause 2 of this Schedule. If, however, a calculation of transfer value based on pension rights earned in accordance with the provisions of Order in Council $\frac{9^*}{NPP}$ of 25th July 1978 produces a greater sum than a calculation in accordance with the terms of Schedule III above the former shall be used to provide the basis for the transfer value calculation.

5. Transfer values for those leaving the Service will be calculated using the tables for this purpose common to the rest of the public sector transfer network.

6. Any outstanding contributions for widow's pension at the time of transfer will be deducted from the preserved terminal grant before calculation of the transfer value.

7. Where a Serviceman leaves with insufficient service to qualify for a preserved pension but is awarded a gratuity (eg. on invaliding) a transfer value may be paid provided that the person makes a payment in respect of the gratuity to Navy Funds of such amount as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine.

8. A person joining the Service on or after 1st April 1975 in respect of whom a transfer payment is accepted from his former pension scheme will be credited with reckonable service as calculated using special tables prepared by the Government Actuary which take account of the early ages at which members of the Armed Forces Pension Scheme can receive immediate retired pay or pension.

9. The transfer value tables will be applied to the transfer value to give equal periods of reckonable service for personal pension, terminal grant and (for both married and unmarried men) half-rate widow's pension. The length of reckonable service credited may, however, be restricted in those circumstances where the limits laid down from time to time by the Inland Revenue for approved occupational pension schemes would otherwise be exceeded.

10. Where service credited is less than service actually served in the old scheme, the previous service will count as to its actual length for the purpose of the 5 year qualifying period for pension benefits. However, neither actual service in previous employment nor service credited will count towards the minimum period of service necessary for the award below the age of 55 years of immediate retired pay or pension.

SCHEDULE VII

Section I

1. The provisions of this Schedule shall apply to regular officers and ratings or other ranks of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines (including officers and ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Service and Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service) who are retired compulsorily for redundancy on or after 1st April 1975.

- (a) Where an officer or rating who has received compensation under the provisions of this Schedule is within five years of redundancy re-employed in peace-time in any one of the Armed Forces, he shall be required to refund a proportion of any special capital payment paid to him, in accordance with the provisions of Clauses 7 and 18 of Schedule IV as appropriate.
- visions of Clauses / and to be beneated it appropriate.
 (b) Where an officer, rating or other rank who has received compensation under the terms of this Schedule takes up a retired officer or similar post in the Ministry of Defence or other Government department or obtains an established appointment in the Home Civil Service or Foreign Service under special schemes which reserve vacancies for former members of the Forces, he shall, if taking up the appointment within 2 years of his premature retirement, discharge or transfer to the reserve, be required to refund such part of the special capital payment as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine.

Section II

Special Capital Payments to Officers on Permanent Commissions

- 3.—(a) An officer of the rank of Rear Admiral or below who is prematurely retired under a redundancy programme on or after 1st April 1975 may be granted a tax-free Special Capital Payment as set out below in addition to any award for which he may be eligible.
- addition to any award for which he may be eligible. (b) The payments set out below for whole years of service may be enhanced in respect of each further calendar month of completed or uncompleted service by 1/12th of the extra compensation payable for a further year of uncompleted service, subject to a maximum enhancement not in excess of 18 month's pay in the case of officers with 12 years qualifying service or more or 19 months' pay where an officer has less than 12 years' qualifying service:

4. Special Capital Payments shall be assessed as follows:

(a) Pay shall be the basic military salary in issue on the last day of full pay service or, if more favourable, the rate appropriate to the paid acting rank held or conclusion of the last appointment before retirement, excluding all forms of additional pay and allowances in either case.

(b) A month's pay shall be calculated by multiplying the daily rate by 365 and dividing by 12.

Retired Pay and Terminal Grants

5. An officer who is retired on redundancy may, in addition to the special capital payment be granted an award as follows:

(a) If he has completed 16 or more years' reckonable service: normal retired pay and terminal grant assessed in accordance with Schedule I.

- (b) If he has completed 12 years' qualifying service but less than 16 years' reckonable service: retired pay and terminal grant assessed as a proportion of the 16 year rate of retired pay for his rank according
- 16 year rate of retired pay for his rank according to the length of his reckonable service.
 (c) If he has completed 5 years' reckonable service but less than 12 years' qualifying service, a preserved pension, terminal grant and resettlement grant as appropriate in accordance with the provisions of Schedule III and Section V of Schedule XI.

6. In all cases the requirement of two years' service in the substantive rank may be disregarded for the purposes of this Section.

Section III

Special Capital Payments to Officers serving on Short Career Commissions

7. In the event of premature termination of service owing to redundancy, an officer serving on a short career commission will, in addition to the gratuity due in respect of the period of service actually completed, be awarded a tax-free Special Capital Payment calculated on the following basis:

(a) One month's pay for each year completed; or
 (b) One month's pay for each year by which service is shortened plus one month's pay;

whichever is the less.

8. For each further calendar month in addition to full years of completed or uncompleted service, an adjustment will be made of one-twelfth of the difference if any between the payment for the completed years and the payment for the next complete year.

9. Payments under Clause 7(a) and (b) of this Schedule will be assessed in accordance with Clause 4 of this Schedule.

Section IV

Special Capital Payments to Ratings

10. A rating in receipt of career rate pay who is dis-charged by reason of redundancy may, provided there is no evidence that he would not have engaged, for or would have been refused, an extension of service to complete pensionable service, be awarded a tax-free Special Capital Payment in accordance with the provisions in Clause 12 of this Schedule.

11. For the purpose of Clauses 10, 12, 13 and 15 of this Schedule the term "rating" shall include ratings of the Royal Navy, other ranks Royal Marines, ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Service and Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service who are corplice on or effect let April 1075 serving on or after 1st April 1975.

12. The rates of Special Capital Payments shall be as set out below:

The payments shown for completed years of service may be enhanced in respect of each further calendar month of for a further whole year of service subject to a maximum enhancement of 18 months' pay if the rating has more than 12 years' qualifying service or 19 months' pay if he has less than 12 years' qualifying service.

13. A rating who does not qualify for a special capital payment under the provisions of Clause 10 of this Schedule may nevertheless be granted a tax-free Special Capital Payment under the provisions of this Clause if discharged prematurely by reason of redundancy. The rates of Special Capital Payment shall be as follows:

(a) One month's pay for each complete year by which service is shortened plus one month's pay, or
(b) One month's pay for each year of service completed;

whichever is the less.

For each further calendar month of service in addition to the full years of completed or uncompleted service an adjustment will be made of one-twelfth of the difference, if any, between the payment for the complete years and the payment for the next complete year. The provisions of Clause 14 of this Schedule shall apply to those Special Capital Payments assessed under the provisions of this Clause.

14. Special Capital Payments shall be assessed as follows:

- (a) Pay shall be the standard rate of service pay in issue on the last day of full service, or if more favourable the rate appropriate to the paid rank held on conclusion of the last appointment before discharge, including length of service increments but excluding all forms of additional pay and allowances.
 (b) A month's pay shall be calculated by multiplying the daily rate by 365 and dividing by 12.

Pension and terminal grants

15. A rating who is eligible for a Special Capital Pay-ment under Clause 10 or 13 of this Schedule may, in addition, be granted an award as follows:

- (a) If he has at least 22 years' reckonable service: pension and terminal grant assessed under Schedule II.
 (b) If he has at least 12 but less than 22 years' reckonable service: pension and terminal grant assessed as a proportion of the 22 year rate of pension for his rank as defined in Schedule II according to the length of his rank rank as defined in Schedule II according to the length of his rank rank as defined in Schedule II according to the length of his rank rank as defined in Schedule II according to the length of his rank rank rank as defined in Schedule II according to the length
- (c) If he has given a minimum period of either 5 years' reckonable service of 5 years contracted out service but less than 12 years reckonable service a preserved but less than 12 years reckonable service a preserved pension and terminal grant as appropriate in accord-ance with the regulations in Schedule III. The rank on which the pension shall be based is the confirmed or acting rank held at the time of discharge or, if more advantageous, the highest paid rank held for a period of 2 years or more during the last 5 years of service preceding discharge. Should 2 years' service not have been served in any one rank during the previous 5 years, then the regulation in Clause 11 of Schedule II shall apply in cases of redundancy as they would for cases of normal discharge. would for cases of normal discharge.

16. Servicemen selected for redundancy will not be eligible for further acting or substantive promotion whether granted by selection or otherwise but, subject to their occupying a post which justifies its rentention, may retain until final discharge any acting rank held when selected for redundancy.

SCHEDULE VIII

Section I

1. The family pensions and other awards provided for in this Schedule are those payable in respect of the service of deceased Officers, Fleet Chief Petty Officers, Chief Petty Officers, Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines and awards which are payable in respect of deaths which are attributable to service are attributable to service.

2. Except where otherwise stated the term "officers" in this Schedule should be read as including Commissioned Officers of the Royal Navy and of the Royal Marines and "RN rating and RM other rank" should be read as including Fleet Chief Petty Officers, Chief Petty Officers. Petty Officers and other ratings of the Royal Navy and Non-Commissioned Officers and other ranks of the Royal Marines Marines.

3. The officer or RN rating or RM other rank in respect of whose death forces family pension is claimed must have had an entitlement to retired pay or pension or preserved pension.

Section II

General Conditions Governing the Award of Family Pensions

4. If the death of an officer, RN rating or RM other rank was due wholly or in part to his own negligence or misconduct or to any cause within his own control the award and amount of any family pension payable shall be at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence.

5. If the applicant is granted any other pension or allow-ance from public funds payable by virtue of the deceased's service then the Secretary of State for Defence may at his discretion withhold or reduce any award otherwise admissible.

- -(a) Where an officer, RN rating or RM other rank has suffered an abatement of his retired pay or pension 6.-
- has suffered an abatement of his retired pay or pension (whether preserved or immediate) on account of his misconduct or inefficiency such abatement may be ignored when assessing any benefits payable to his wife and children under the terms of this Schedule, except as provided in sub-Clause (b) below. (b) Where the Secretary of State for Defence is of the opinion that the misconduct of an officer, RN rating or RM other rank constitutes a grave offence against the State as defined in Clause 14 of the Schedule to Order in Council $\frac{9^*}{NPP}$ of 25th July 1978 and he is satisfied that the man's widow wilfully aided and abetted the commission of that offence he may in is discretion direct that any pension payable to the widow discretion direct that any pension payable to the widow or children may be abated by such amount as seems to him appropriate having regard to all the circum-stances of the case.

7. If a widow dies before establishing her claim to pension, arrears of pension will not, save in exceptional circumstances, be allowed to her estate.

8. The date of commencement of family pension will normally, if application is not unduly delayed, be the date following the husband's death or if death occurs in service the date following the last issue of short-term pension.

9. In exceptional circumstances the Secretary of State for Defence may at his discretion withhold a part of a pension granted under this Schedule and may divert such pension in whole or in part for purposes which he may deem bene-ficial for the pensioner.

Conditions Relating to Marriage

- 0.—(a) A widow who was married to the deceased officer, RN rating or RM other rank before his retire-ment or discharge from the service, or before the completion of any further service that may have entitled the officer, RN rating or RM other rank to re-assessed retired pay or pension may be awarded a pension under Sections III or IV of this Schedule as appropriate.) A widow who was married to the deceased officer
- (b) A widow who was married to the deceased officer, RN rating or RM other rank after his retirement or discharge may be awarded a pension under the terms of Clause 4 of the Schedule to Order in Council of 25th July 1978 which provides for a widow's pen-sion at the annual rate of $\frac{2}{3}$ th per cent of the husband's final pensionable salary for each year and fraction of a year of his contracted-out service, for such time as she is also eligible for a National Insurance Widowed Mother's Allowance, Widow's or Category B Retire-ment Pension ment Pension.
- (c) If the death of the officer or rating occurred within a year of his marriage the Secretary of State for Defence may reduce or withhold the amount of any award otherwise admissible.

11. The pension of a widow who re-marries will cease, but if she again becomes a widow her pension may be restored in whole or part at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence.

Effect of Separation on Widow's Pension and Gratuity

- 12.—(a) An award of pension to a widow who is separ-ated from her husband at the date of his death will be at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence who may withhold all or such a proportion of the pension as seems appropriate to him in all the circumstances.
- (b) If a widow is shown to be living with a man as his wife she will not be eligible for a pension.

Conditions for the award of Children's Pensions

13.—(a) A "child" for the purposes of the award of a pension under this Schedule means:

(1) a legitimate child of the officer, RN rating or RM other rank provided that the child's mother ful-filled the conditions relating to marriage contained in Clause 10(a); or

(2) a step-child of the officer, RN rating or RM other rank who was mainly dependent on him at the time of his death, provided that the child's mother fulfilled the conditions relating to marriage contained in Clause 10(a); or

(3) a child adopted by the officer, RN rating or RM other rank, or by his wife, before his retirement or discharge (or, if he subsequently gave further service in circumstances rendering him eligible for a re-assessment of retired pay or service pension, before the termination of such further service), who was mainly dependent upon him at the time of his death, and provided that the child's mother by adoption fulfilled the conditions relating to marriage contained in Clause 10(a); or

in Clause 10(a); or (4) a child mainly dependent upon the officer, RN rating or RM other rank before his retirement or discharge (or, if he subsequently gave further service in circumstances rendering him eligible for re-assess-ment of retired pay or service pension, before the termination of such further service) who was adopted by the officer, RN rating or RM other rank, or by his wife after his retirement or discharge (or after the termination of further service) provided that the Secretary of State for Defence is satisfied that the officer, RN rating or RM other rank had formed the intention of adopting the child before retirement or discharge (or before the termination of further service) and that the child was mainly dependent upon him at the time of his death, and provided that the child's mother by adoption fulfilled the conditions relating to marriage contained in Clause 10(a); or (5) an illegitimate child of the officer, RN rating or

to marriage contained in Clause 10(a); or
(5) an illegitimate child of the officer, RN rating or RM other rank, or of his wife, born before his retire-ment or discharge (or, if he subsequently gave further service in circumstances rendering him eligible for reassessment of retired pay or service pension, before the termination of such further service), who was mainly dependent upon him at the time of his death, and provided that where the child is the illegitimate child of the wife, the wife fulfilled the conditions relating to marriage contained in Clause 10(a).
(b) A child's pension will normally cease when the child attains the age of 17 years, except where an officer, Fleet Chief Petty Officer or Regimental Ser-geant-Major, Royal Marines, was retired or discharged before 31st March 1973 when payment of a child's pension will normally cease at the age of 18 years. However, it may be granted or continued after these ages:

ages:

(1) if the child continues to receive full-time educa-tion then the normal limit will be 3 years from the age of 18 years but the pension may be further continued where there are circumstances justifying special consideration; or

(2) the child is an apprentice not receiving more than nominal wages; or

(3) if, before attaining the age referred to above the child was and continues to be afflicted by mental or bodily infirmity and is therefore incapable of earning his

- bodily infimity and is therefore incapable of earning his or her own living, provided the Secretary of State for Defence considers that the pecuniary circumstances of the child and family are such to justify the award.
 (c) Children's pensions will be paid to the widow or mother of the child, or other person responsible for the child's maintenance, or to the child direct as may be decided by the Secretary of State for Defence.
 (d) Pensions of children of officers and of Fleet Chief Petty Officers and Regimental Segregant-Majors Royal
- Petty Officers and Regimental Sergeant-Majors, Royal Marines, may be issued quarterly in advance.

Effect of Commutation

14.—(a) Except as provided for in sub-Clauses (b) and (c) below, commutation of retired pay or service pen-sion shall not debar a widow or children, otherwise eligible under the provisions of this Section, from receiving an award of pension nor shall any such pension be reduced or abated on that account.

- (b) Where a retired officer, rating or other rank gives further service entitling him to a re-assessment of his retired pay or pension, and before or during the period of his re-employment he marries having first commuted a portion of the retired pay granted him in respect of his original service, then any award of pension to the widow may be reduced by an amount proportionate to the amount of retired pay originally commuted.
- (c) Any legitimate or illegitimate child born after com-mutation, a stepchild eligible by virtue of a marriage after commutation or a child adopted after commuta-tion shall likewise suffer an abatement of pension proportionate to the amount of retired pay or pension originally commuted.

Section III

Non-Attributable Benefits for the Dependants of those whose Service ceased before 31st March 1973

15. The provisions of this Section shall apply to the widows and children of officers, RN ratings and RM other ranks who ceased to serve on or before 31st March 1973 and who were granted service retired pay or pension:

- (a) Widows and children of Temporary Branch Officers Sergeant-Majors RM) will be eligible for a pension provided reckonable service was given after 31st August 1950.
- (b) In the case of those RN ratings and RM other ranks who died before 4th November 1958 the widows or children will only be eligible for a pension if the following minimum periods of reckonable service were completed:

16. The rate of widow's pension will be one-third of the husband's rate of half-pay, retired pay or pension. The rate of half pay, retired pay or pension will be the basic rate, ignoring, subject to the exception in Clause 14 any commutation that may have been made, plus all the pensions increases appropriate to the basic rate whether or not the husband qualified for these increases by virtue of age or health.

Awards to Children

17. Where an officer, RN rating or RM other rank was retired or discharged before 31st March 1973, each eligible child may receive one-third or if motherless, two-thirds, of the rate of widow's pension appropriate to the rank of service of the officer, RN rating or RM other rank.

Minimum Rates of Family Pensions

18. If the rates of pension for the widows of those officers, RN ratings and RM other ranks retired, discharged or who died in service before 31st March 1973 calculated in accord-ance with Clause 16 would be less than the minimum rates set out in Clause 15 of Schedule IX, the latter will be payable.

Section IV

Non-Attributable Family Pensions and Gratuities to the Dependants of those Officers, Ratings and Other Ranks who gave Reckonable Service on or after 31st March 1973

19. Pensions may be awarded to the widows and depend-ants of officers, ratings and other ranks who retired on or after 31st March 1973 and were in receipt of half pay, retired pay or pension or service invaliding retired pay or pension or who were serving at the date of their death and would have been so entitled had they been invalided on the dott of dotth the date of death.

20. Where the husband exercised the option to purchase an entitlement to a half-rate widow's pension for service up to 31st March 1973 the rate of widow's pension shall be

one-half of the husband's rate of half pay, retired pay or pension which was in payment to the husband at the date of his death or for which he would have been eligible had he been invalided on the date of death, ignoring, subject to the exception in Clause 14, any commutation that may have been made, plus all pensions increases appropriate to the basic rate whether or not the husband qualified for these by virtue of age and health.

21. Where no option was exercised, the rate of widow's pension shall be one-third of the husband's rate of halfpension shall be one-third of the husband's rate of half-pay, retired pay or pension for service prior to 1st April 1973 and one-half for service thereafter. The husband's rate shall be calculated as in Clause 20. Where the pension is calculated by reference to the husband's service invalid-ing retired pay or pension, the element in the husband's award which is the result of the special invaliding enhance-ment will attract a half rate widow's pension. The enhancement is the difference between the rate of invaliding retired pay or pension and a rate calculated at 3 per cent for officers and 2.75 per cent for ratings and other ranks, of the maximum rate of retired pay or pension for his rank for each year of reckonable service. for each year of reckonable service.

22. Where the cause of death of an officer or RN rating or RM other rank who has been invalided attributably is regarded as not attributable to his service, the rate of any family pension payable will be based on the service invaliding retired pay or pension for which he may have been eligible.

Awards to Children

23.—(a) The rate of children's pension for the children (as defined in Clause 13) of all officers, RN ratings and RM other ranks who gave service on or after 31st March 1973 shall be:

(1) one-quarter of the father's half pay, retired pay or pension for each of two children where there is a widow;

(2) one-third of the father's half pay, retired pay or pension for each of three motherless children.

- (b) For the purposes of sub-Clause (a) of this Clause where eligible children are not being maintained by their mother or where there are more eligible children than the maximum number specified in sub-Clause (a) of this Clause and they are living in separate house-holds the award and allocation of children's pensions shall be at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence.
- Gratuities to Dependants of Serving Officers, ratings and Other Ranks
 - 24.—(a) The provisions of Clauses 25 to 35 shall apply to the widows and children of officers, ratings and other ranks who die while serving on full pay.
 (b) The same general conditions applicable to the award of pensions set out in Section II of this Schedule shall or pensions are set of the section II of this schedule shall or pensions.
 - apply to the award of a gratuity under the provisions of this Section.

25. Irrespective of length of service where an officer, including a short career officer, RN rating or RM other rank dies while serving on full pay on the Active List, his widow may be granted a gratuity equal to the terminal grant or gratuity for which the husband would have been eligible had he been invalided on the day of his death; or if greater, a gratuity equal to twice the rate of retired pay or pension of her husbands' rank for invaliding purposes appropriate to 34 years of service for an officer, or 37 years of service for a RN rating or RM other rank.

years of service for a KN rating or KM other rank. 26. Where an officer, RN rating or RM other rank has retired with retired pay or been discharged to pension or has been invalided with invaliding retired pay or pension or with invaliding gratuity dies within one year of retire-ment or discharge his widow may be awarded a gratuity equal to the difference between the gratuity which would have been payable if he had died in service on the day of retirement or discharge and the amount of terminal grant or gratuity and any sum raised by commutation which he received. received.

27. Where, had the officer or RN rating or RM other rank been invalided, an adjustment would have been made on his award in respect of a gratuity or other non-effective payment previously received by him, an abatement may be made on that account in assessing the gratuity payable under Clauses 25 or 26.

28. Where the officer or RN rating or RM other rank did not leave a widow eligible for an award under this section

but a child or children (as defined in Clause 13 and fulfilling the conditions of that Clause), the Secretary of State for Defence may award a gratuity to the child or children. The total award shall equal that which would have been payable to a widow eligible for an award under this section and shall be apportioned among them at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence.

29. Where the officer or RN rating or RM other rank leaves a widow and in addition a child or children (as defined in Clause 13 and fulfilling the conditions of that Clause) who are not living with or supported by her, the Secretary of State for Defence may divert part of the gratuity which would normally be payable to the widow for the benefit of the children.

30. Where a member of the Women's Services dies in circumstances in which the child of a female member would have been granted a gratuity under Clause 28 leaves an eligible child or children (as defined in Clause 13) the Secretary of State for Defence may award a gratuity for the benefit of the child or children of such amount as he may determine.

31. Gratuities in respect of children may be issued to the widow or mother of the child or other person responsible for the child's maintenance or to the child direct as may be decided. The gratuity may where appropriate, be issued in instalments or withheld for later payment, i.e. when the children are no longer eligible for pension or have reached the age of 18 years whichever is the earlier.

32. Where an officer, RN rating or RM other rank (inclu-ding a member of the Women's Services) dies in service and neither an eligible widow nor motherless child nor children are left, a sum equal to the gratuity otherwise payable under Clause 25 to the widow may be payable to the estate of the deceased.

33. Gratuities payable under Clause 32 may be abated in respect of any public or service debt.

34. Any outstanding balance due from an officer, RN rating or RM other rank who has elected to purchase an enhanced pension entitlement for his widow in respect of his service before 1st April 1973 may be deducted from any gratuity payable under the provisions of Clause 25.

35. No abatement of a gratuity payable by virtue of this section other than that provided by Clauses 27, 33 and 34 shall be made respect of any public or service debt due from the deceased officer or RN rating or RM other rank.

Forces Family Pensions where the husband retired or was discharged with a Preserved Pension

36. Subject to the conditions of section II of this Schedule the provisions of Clauses 37 to 38 below shall apply to the widows and children of those officers, RN ratings and RM other ranks, who died on or after 31st March 1975 in receipt of, or with a future entitlement to, a preserved pension.

37. The widow of a pensioner who dies in retirement whilst in receipt of a preserved pension may be granted a Forces Family Pension of one-third of that portion of the husband's pension earned by service prior to 1st April 1973, and one-half of the portion earned by subsequent service, except where the husband had elected to purchase entitlement to a half rate widow's pension in which case the rate will be one half throughout. In addition, pensions may be granted to any eligible children at the rates and in accordance with the conditions specified in Clause 23.

38. Should an officer, RN rating or RM other rank die before his preserved pension or terminal grant becomes payable then a Forces Family Pension may be granted to his widow and/or children at the following rates:

(a) Widow's pension. The appropriate fractions, as set out in Clause 37 of the husband's initial pension assessment as enhanced by all relevant pension increase measures introduced between the date of his retirement and the date of his death.

(b) Children's pension.

(1) One-quarter of the father's initial pension assessment (as enhanced by all relevant pensions increase measures) of each of two dependent children; or

(2) one-third of the father's initial pension assessment (as enhanced by all relevant pensions increase measures) for each of three motherless children. In the event of apportionment being necessary the award and allocation of children's pension shall be at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence. (c) Terminal Grant. On the husband's death, his widow or eligible children, or widow and in addition a child or children who are not living with or supported by her (as specified in Clause 29), may be awarded a gratuity equal to the preserved terminal grant. The value of the preserved terminal grant shall be the initial assessment of the award as enhanced by all pensions increase measures introduced between the husband's date of retirement and his death. If he leaves neither an eligible widow nor eligible children a payment equal to the preserved terminal grant will be made to the estate of the deceased.

39. Where the death of an officer, RN rating or RM 39. Where the death of an other, KN rating or RM other rank occurs before his preserved pension has been put into payment the widow will not be eligible for a short-term family pension under section V of this Schedule. If the preserved pension has become payable however (whether by reason of age or otherwise) then the widow may receive a short-term family pension at the rates and in accordance with the conditions set out in section V of this Schedule.

Section V

Short-Term Family Pension

40. Where an officer, RN rating or RM other rank who has given service on or after 1st April 1973 dies either in service after having completed more than 5 years' service from the age of 18 years or in retirement with retired pay and pension, the widow or motherless children may be paid for a period of 91 days a short-term family pension equal to the rate of her husband's pay or half-pay on the day he died, excluding additional pay and allowances, or the actual rate of her husband's retired pay or pension in issue at the time of his death. This short-term pension may be increased if it is less than the normal family pension.

41. When a short career officer or a pensionable officer, RN rating or RM other rank with less than 5 years' service from the age of 18 years dies in service, a short-term pension equal to the husband's rate of pay on the day he died, excluding additional pay and allowances, may be paid for the following periods:

42. Where eligible children are living in separate house-holds the short-term pension payable under Clauses 40 and 41 may be allocated at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence.

Section VI

Attributable Family Pensions for the Dependants of those whose deaths are attributable to Service

43. The provisions of this Section apply only to the dependants of officers, RN ratings and RM other ranks who gave service on or after 31st March 1973.

44. Where such an officer, RN rating or RM other rank dies in service from causes accepted by the Department of Health and Social Security as being attributable to or aggravated by his service or dies in retirement from causes whelly or mainly due to the injury or disease which resulted in his being attributably invalided, the widow may be awarded an attributable family pension at the rates shown in Clause 13 of Schedule IX.

45. If an officer, RN rating or RM other rank dies in retirement from causes accepted by the Department of Health and Social Security as being attributable to his ser-vice but who was not invalided attributably, the award of attributable family pension(s) will at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence.

46. A Forces Family Pension will not be payable in addition.

47. Rank for the purpose of the award of attributable family pension shall be according to rank for invaliding purposes.

48. Where an award of attributable family pension is made the payment of a short-term family pension under Clause 40 and 41 may not exceed 91 days.

49. The date of commencement of an attributable family pension shall normally be the day after the end of payment of the short-term pension under Clauses 40 and 41 unless the Secretary of State for Defence considers there are circumstances justifying special consideration.

Section VII

Family Pension where a War Widow's Pension is Paid

50. Widows of officers, RN ratings and RM other ranks who were retired or discharged before 31st March 1973 and whose death is due to service may receive a family pension as provided for in the Order in Council $\frac{45^{*}}{\text{NPP}}$ of 4th February 1972 if the family is in receipt of a Department of Health and Social Security War Widow's Pension.

(b) Rates of Service Retired Pay:

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51. The family pension awarded to the widow of an officer will be abated by the difference between her war widow's pension and the war widow's pension for the widow of a Fleet Chief Petty Officer. The children's pension will not be subject to such reductions.

SCHEDULE IX

Section 1

1. When an officer's or rating's reckonable service exceeds an exact number of years (up to and including 33 or 36 years as appropriate) by one or more complete days of a year, his retired pay or pension will be increased by that number of days as a fraction of 365 of the difference between the rate for the number of years completed and the rate that would have been awarded had a further year been served. In this clause the terms retired pay and pension includes service invaliding retired pay or pension.

2.—(a) An Admiral of the Fleet is eligible for half pay at the rate of £15,500 per annum.

SCHEDULE X

Resettlement Commutation

1. The provisions of this Schedule relate to officers of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service and the Women's Royal Naval Service, ratings of the Royal Navy and other ranks of the Royal Marines and Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Marines and Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Marines and Naval Nurses of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service, and ratings of the Women's Royal Naval Service who leave the Service with title to immediate retired pay or pension. Under the Resettlement Commutation Scheme an officer or rating may commute part of his retired pay or pension to obtain an additional tax-free lump sum, subject to the following conditions:

- (a) if he gives Service on or after 31st March 1978
- (b) if his health is satisfactory on leaving the Service
- (c) if he retires before the age of 55 years.

2. Subject to the provisions of Clause 3, the maximum sum which can be realised will be the difference between the terminal grant actually awarded on leaving the Service and the 34 year (officers) of 37 year (ratings) rate of terminal grant for his rank under the pension code current at the date of retirement or discharge.

3. The amount of retired pay or pension to be temporarily given up to secure the capital sum will be determined in accordance with the table in Clause 10. Temporary surren-der of more than 50 per cent of retired pay or pension will not be permitted.

4. At the age of 55 years the retired pay or pension surrendered under the provisions of Clause 3 will be res-tored and Pensions Increases will be awarded on the full basic retired pay or pension awarded on retirement or discharge.

General Conditions

A

5. Resettlement commutation may be exercised only once and application must be made within 12 months of retirement or discharge.

6. A Rating who has commuted part of his pension under the provisions of this Schedule will not be permitted to commute under the scheme for life commutation until after the age of 55 years (if he gave service on or before 31st March 1978).

7. Officers whose last day of service is before 6th April 1996 may be permitted at one and the same time to com-mute retired pay under both the resettlement arrangement and the life commutation arrangements provided that:

- (a) the maximum amount has been or is currently being taken up under the provisions of this schedule.
- (b) the total pension given does not exceed 50 per cent of the basic award of retired pay and the element surrendered for life does not exceed 50 per cent of the retired pay attributable to reckonable service before 6th April 1980.

8. Officers who give service on or before 31st March 1978 may after attaining the age of 55 years apply to commute under the life commutation provisions.

9. Invaliding and Service attributable retired pay and pensions will not normally be eligible for commutation under the provisions of this schedule.

SCHEDULE XI

1. The awards under the provisions of this Schedule are outside the scope of the Armed Forces Pension Scheme.

Section I

Service Gratuities for Short Career Officers Gratuities for Short Career Medical and Dental Officers

2. An officer entering the Medical or Dental Branches of the Royal Navy on a short career commission of 3 or 5 years' duration may, if the full period of Active List service undertaken is satisfactorily completed be awarded a gratuity of £895 for each year of service.

3. Women Medical and Dental Officers leaving on marriage or for compassionate reasons where the Secretary of State for Defence is satisfied that such reasons necessitate retirement may be awarded a gratuity proportionate to the length of Active List service actually completed.

4. An officer appointed to a short career commission in the Medical or Dental Branches of the Royal Navy whose from Navy Department funds under a scheme for the entry of student doctors and student deptists, may, on satisfactory completion of Active List service subsequent to full registration be granted a gratuity calculated as follows:

- (a) in respect of service on the Active List completed after full registration as set out in Clause 2 above with an addition;
- an addition;
 (b) in respect of the period under training prior to full registration including in the case of Medical Officers, the period between provisional and full registration: at the rate of £360 a year abated by;
 (c) a sum representing the net amount expended from Navy Department Funds on tuition and maintenance during the period under training prior to full registration or in the case of Medical Officers the period under training prior to provisional registration training prior to provisional registration.

Gratuities for Other Officers

5. Other officers serving on gratuity-earning short career commissions may on satisfactory completion of service on or after 1st April 1979 be granted a gratuity of £755 for each year of service.

Section II

Gratuities for Supplementary List Aircrew Serving on Pen-sionable Commissions

6. Officers serving on Type B pensionable commissions who exercise their options to leave the Service at their 8 or 12 year breakpoints which occur on or after 6th April 1978 will be entitled to either: A preserved pension and preserved tax-free terminal grant payable at the age of 60 years in accordance with Schedule III based on reckonable service from 6th April 1978, plus an immediate tax-free gratuity of £4,320 if leaving on completion of 8 years' satisfactory service, or a tax-free gratuity of £5,000 if leaving on completion of 12 years' satisfactory service, plus where eligible, a tax free re-settlement grant under the provisions of Section V of this Schedule ; or a preserved pension and preserved tax-free terminal grant payable at the age of 60 years in accordance with Schedule III based on all reckonable service from the age of 21 years' reckonable service will also qualify for an immediate tax-free resettlement grant (see Section V of this Schedule). If they leave at any time other than at their optional breakpoints any award of retired pay, preserved pensions, or gratuity will be assessed in accordance with the provisions of Schedules I and III.

Section III

Gratuities for Members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service and Officers of the Women's Royal Naval Service

(Nore. For the general purposes of this Section, the term "officer" shall include a member of the Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service.)

7. WRNS officers and Nursing Sisters entered for short service will, on satisfactorily completing the period of service undertaken, be eligible for a gratuity at the rate of £721 for each year of short service.

8. Short career officers whose service is terminated on marriage or for compassionate reasons where the Secretary of State for Defence is satisfied that such reasons necessitate retirement or termination of service will be eligible for a gratuity at the rate of £721 a year proportionate to the length of short career commission actually completed. The minimum of 1 year's service stipulated in Clause 10(c) of this Schedule may be disregarded for purposes of award under this sub-Clause.

Section IV

General Conditions attached to the award of Short Career Gratuities

9. When an officer's qualifying service (for gratuity purposes) exceeds a given number of years by one or more complete days of a year, his award of gratuity will be increased by that number of days as a fraction of 365 of the difference between the rate for the number of years completed and the rate that would have been awarded had a further complete year been served.

10. Should the officer fail to complete the full period of Active List service which he had undertaken, an award may nevertheless be made as follows:

- (a) If his service is terminated on account of disability not due to causes within his own control, he will be granted a gratuity proportionate to the length of Active List service he has actually completed.
- (b) If his service is terminated for non-employment, or incapacity, unsuitability, or inefficiency not due to causes within his own control, or if he is permitted voluntarily to terminate his service within 6 months of the completion of the full period of Active List service he has undertaken, he may be awarded either a gratuity proportionate to the length of Active List service he has actually completed or a reduced gratuity at such rate as the Secretary of State for Defence may determine.
- (c) If he is permitted voluntarily to terminate his service more than 6 months before the conclusion of the period he has undertaken, no gratuity will be payable to a Pilot or Observer unless he has completed at least 18 months' satisfactory service and is in possession of the flying badge, nor to an officer of any other Branch unless he has completed at least 1 year's satisfactory service. Thereafter he may be allowed at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence, such gratuity as may be determined, but not in any event exceeding three-quarters of the amount proportionate to the length of his actual service on the Active List.
- (d) If his service is terminated owing to disability due to causes within his own control or to inefficiency or other cause within his own control but not amounting to misconduct, he may be allowed, at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence, such gratuity as may be determined, but not in any event exceeding the amount which would have been admissible had he been allowed to terminate his service voluntarily.

(e) If his service is terminated on account of misconduct, the special payment of a compassionate gratuity shall be within the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence according to the circumstances of his case, but the award will not in any event exceed 90 per cent of the gratuity which would have been admissible had he left voluntarily.

11. Where a short career commissioned officer dies in service leaving neither a widow not dependent children, a lump sum payment may be made to his estate equal to twice the annual rate of full career pension for an officer of his rank or the amount of gratuity which would be payable had the officer been invalided on the day he died, if this is greater.

12. If an officer serving on a short career commission continues on full pay beyond the period of Active List service which he had undertaken, payment of the gratuity will be deferred until the end of such further service.

13. A short career commissioned officer who is granted a permanent commission will not be eligible for any gratuity in respect of his service on a short career commission, but his service on that commission may count towards an ultimate award of retired pay or gratuity as a permanent or pensionable officer. If, after receipt of a gratuity in respect of short service, an officer is granted a permanent or pensionable commission his previous service will not be reckonable towards an ultimate award of retired pay or gratuity as a pensionable officer, unless satisfactory arrangements are made for the refund of the short service gratuity.

14. A short career commissioned officer who has transferred to that commission from a pensionable commission solely because of failure to complete training due to causes outside his control including medical unfitness may, in addition to the gratuity in respect of his short service be awarded on final satisfactory completion a gratuity at the rate provided for in Clause 33 of Schedule I in respect of pensionable service provided it was given before 6th April 1978.

15. Service on a short career commission in the medical, dental or education branches of the Royal Navy, may, in certain circumstances, be treated as contributory service under the National Health Services (Superannuation) Regulations or under the Teachers' (Superannuation) Regulations or under the officer's contribution will be advanced by the Ministry of Defence and the total amount so advanced will be deducted from the gratuity for which the officer is eligible under the provisions of this Section. When contributions have been so advanced but as a result of being transferred to a permanent or pensionable commission the officer does not qualify for a gratuity under this Section, no refund of the employer's contributions will be required from the officer, but in order that his previous service may be reckonable towards an ultimate award of retired pay or gratuity as a permanent officer he will be required to refund the employee's contributions advanced on his behalf by the Ministry of Defence. Service which counts for service retired pay may not also count as reckonable service for purposes of pension under the appropriate civil superannuation scheme.

SECTION V

Resettlement Grants

16. A tax-free resettlement grant may be granted to officers, ratings or other ranks who have been awarded preserved pensions in accordance with Schedule III, subject to satisfactory service and provided that:

- (a) officers have completed at least 9 years' reckonable service (from the age of 21 years), and;
- (b) ratings or other ranks have completed at least 12 years' reckonable service (from the age of 18 years). The rates of resettlement grant will be:

17. If an officer, rating or other rank is discharged for inefficiency within his own control or for misconduct then the award and amount of a resettlement grant shall be at the discretion of the Secretary of State for Defence providing that should an officer, rating or other rank be discharged for misconduct any resettlement grant payable under the pro-visions of this Schedule shall be abated by not less than 10 per cent of the amount payable had the discharge been on other grounds.

18. Any resettlement grant awarded on release may be subject to partial refund on re-entry to the Service. The amount repayable will depend on the length of the break of service. (2 SI)
