

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL OF LICENCE TO ABSTRACT WATER

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the Anglian Water Authority, Great Ouse River Division, by Messrs. Allpress Farms Limited of Holly House Farm, Horseyway, Chatteris, Cambridgeshire, for the renewal of Licence No. 6/33/34/132/4 to abstract the following quantities of water from District Internal Drains and Commissioners' Drains at the following points of abstraction: Hubbersteads Farm, Swaffham Prior, Cambridgeshire; Blinkers Hill Farm, Swaffham Prior, Cambridgeshire; 18,000 gallons per hour; 126,000 gallons per day; 3½ million gallons per year, from April to September in each year for spray irrigation of agricultural crops.

NOTICE OF PROPOSALS FOR A LICENCE TO ABSTRACT WATER

Notice is hereby given that the South West Water Authority have formulated proposals as follows: To abstract 3,500 cubic metres (0.77 million gallons) of water per day, with a total of 700,000 cubic metres (154 million gallons) per annum from the Fortescue Mineshaft at National Grid Reference SW 667389 in the Parish of Camborne-Redruth in the area of the Kerrier District Council.

Further details of the proposal are that the licence will stay in force for a period of 7 years in order to provide for temporary abstraction to make up deficiencies in the quantities of water available for the Camborne area until water is available as the result of the Colliford Reservoir development.

Details of the proposals comprising a draft licence and copies of any relevant plans may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the Authority at 3-5 Barnfield Road, Exeter, Devon, and at Gloweth, Truro, Cornwall, at all reasonable hours during the period beginning on 7th May 1980 and ending on 4th June 1980.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR LICENCE TO OBSTRUCT OR IMPEDE THE FLOW OF AN INLAND WATER BY MEANS OF IMPOUNDING WORKS.

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the South West Water Authority by Mr. C. ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

BEDFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The Bedfordshire County Council (Bedford Street Woburn) (Prohibition of Waiting) Variation Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that on 30th April 1980, the Bedfordshire County Council made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part I of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 varying the Bedfordshire County Council (Bedford Street, Woburn) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1969.

The effect of the Order as from 21st May 1980, will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at all times in the following lengths of road in Woburn:

1. The east side of High Street (Market Place) which extends from its junction with Park Street in a northerly direction for a distance of approximately 39 yards.

2. The north side of Park Street which extends from its junction with High Street in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 25 yards. Exemptions are provided in the Order (to enable goods to be loaded onto or from a vehicle) to enable persons to board or alight from a vehicle, to enable a vehicle to be used in connection with any funeral, removal of furniture, any building operation or demolition, and for disabled drivers parking.

A copy of the Order and the Order varied by it and a plan showing the roads concerned may be inspected at the offices of the undersigned at County Hall, Bedford.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act, or any Regulation under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within 6 weeks of the 6th May 1980, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

BEDFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Bedfordshire (Moor End/Bower Lane, Eaton Bray) (Traffic Regulation) Order 1980

Imposition of one way traffic system in Eaton Bray

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Bedfordshire propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which will be to require vehicles on the 56 metre length of Moor End (U.C. 232) which forms the eastern part of the junction with Bower Lane (U.C. 228) to proceed in a south-westerly direction only along its whole length.
