NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR A COMBINED LICENCE TO OBSTRUCT OR IMPEDE THE FLOW OF AN INLAND WATER BY MEANS OF IMPOUNDING WORKS AND TO ABSTRACT WATER.

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the Yorkshire Water Authority by Peter Bailie Ervine, of Bradbury Wood, Wingerworth, Chesterfield, for a combined licence to obstruct or impede the flow of Tricket Brook by means of a small weir with sluice gates at NGR SK 378671 in the parish of Wingerworth, and to abstract 3,300 gallons of water per hour, 79,200 gallons per day and 14,573 million gallons during May to October each year from the said inland water at or near that point.

The capacity of the reservoir at overflow level will be approximately 17,000 gallons.

20,625 gallons per hour, 490,000 gallons per day,
148.5 million gallons per annum.

BOSTON BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Boston (Parking Places and Controlled Parking Zone) (No. 22) Order 1979
