The County of Hereford and Worcester (Footpath No. 11 (Part), Pinvin) Public Path Diversion Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 16th May 1980 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the County Council of Hereford and Worcester.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert that length of Footpath No. 11 in the Parish of Pinvin situate off Church Lane, commencing at a point a distance of approximately 116 metres (127 yards) south of St. Nicholas' Church, Pinvin, and proceeding in a southerly direction for approximately 42 metres (46 yards) to a point approximately 158 metres (173 yards) south of St. Nicholas' Church and thence in a south-westerly direction for approximately 58 metres (64 yards) to terminate at a point approximately 66 metres (72 yards) east-south-east of the Moat House to a line commencing at a point approximately 78 metres (83 yards) north-east of the Moat House, and proceeding in a southerly direction for approximately 34 metres (38 yards) to a point approximately 63 metres (69 yards) east-north-east of the Moat House, where the route forks into two directions; the first length proceeding in a southerly direction for approximately 50 metres (55 yards) to terminate at the said point approximately 66 metres (72 yards) east-south-east of the Moat House. The second length proceeding in an easterly direction for approximately 29 metres (32 yards) to terminate at the said point approximately 158 metres (173 yards) south of St. Nicholas' Church. The total length of the existing path is approximately 100 metres (110 yards). The total length of the new path is approximately 113 metres (125 yards).
