SOUTH BEDFORDSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL

The South Bedfordshire District (The Parish of Leighton-Linslade) (Box Junctions) Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that on 27th June 1980 the South Bedfordshire District Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with Bedfordshire County Council made this Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation

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Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order which will come into operation on 7th July 1980 will be to define yellow boxed areas on the south-eastern half of Wing Road carriageway extending over the mouth of its junction with Cedars Way for a distance of about 20 metres and on the north-western half of Wing Road carriageway extending over the mouth of its junction with Bunkers Lane a distance of about 29 metres, both in the Parish of Leighton-Linslade and it will be an offence for a driver to take his vehicle into the marked areas when the presence of other stationary vehicles prevents him driving his vehicle out of the areas. Drivers making right hand turns will be exempt from this provision.

The Order, together with maps showing the roads concerned may be examined at either the offices of the Administration Executive, Grove House, 76 High Street North, Dunstable or the offices of Leighton Linslade Town Council, at 6 Leighton Road, Linslade, Leighton Buzzard, between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 4.45 p.m. Mondays to Thursdays, and 8.45 a.m. to 4.15 p.m. on Fridays.

HUMBERSIDE COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Humberside (Kingston-upon-Hull) (East Hull Area) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (No. 2) (Amendment) Order 1980.
