NOW in pursuance of such agreement THIS DEED WITNESSETH AND IT IS HEREBY AGREED as follows:

- 1. (1) IN this deed the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:
 - "the Licence" means petroleum production licence number P. of even date herewith granted by the Secretary of State to the Licensee;
 - "model clauses" means the model clauses incorporated in the Licence and set out in Schedule 5 to the Petroleum (Production) Regulations 1976 as amended by the Petroleum (Production) (Amendment) Regulations 1978 and the Petroleum (Production) (Amendment) ment) Regulations 1980:

"Commercial Decision" means a decision to prepare a programme for the getting of petroleum from the licensed area or any part thereof or for the erecting or carrying out of relevant works in the licensed area or any part thereof;

or any part thereor;

"Petroleum Operations" means any and all operations conducted in the licensed area or any part thereof and directed towards the getting of petroleum therefrom but excluding operations the purpose whereof is searching for petroleum and also excluding any such operations carried out prior to the taking of a Commercial Decision;

"the licensed area" and "petroleum" have the meanings respectively assigned to them in paragraph (1) of clause 1 of the model clauses;

"relevant works" has the meaning assigned to it in paragraph (9) of clause 15 of the model clauses.

- (2) ANY obligations which are to be observed and performed by the Licensee shall at any time at which the Licensee is more than one person be joint and several obligations.
- 2. (1) UPON being so required in writing by the Secretary of State the Licensee will execute an assignment in the form set out in Schedule 2 hereto of the Licence from itself to itself and BNOC.

 (2) SUCH assignment shall be completed within four months from the date of the Secretary of State's request.

- 3. (1) UPON being so requested in writing by the Secretary of State the Licensee will either:
 - (a) enter into an agreement with BNOC providing for the conduct of Petroleum Operations in that part of the licensed area to which a Commercial Decision relates and incorporating the provisions set out in Schedule 3 hereto; or
 - (b) procure that any subsisting agreement for the conduct of Petroleum Operations in the licensed area as a whole or in that part thereof to which a Commercial Decision relates shall be amended by the inclusion therein of BNOC as a party and by the incorporation therein of the provisions set out in Schedule 3 hereto.
- (2) ANY agreement entered into in accordance with paragraph (1)(a) of this clause 3 shall forthwith upon completion be submitted for approval by the Secretary of State and shall contain a provision that with the exception of clause 6 of Schedule 3 it shall not come into full force and effect until it has been approved in writing by the Secretary of State.
- (3) ANY agreement amended in accordance with paragraph (1)(b) of this clause 3 shall in its amended form forthwith upon completion be submitted for approval by the Secretary of State and shall in its amended form contain a provision that with the exception of clause 6 of Schedule 3 it shall not come into full force and effect until it has been approved in writing by the Secretary of

 - 7. THE Licensee shall procure that any third party:
 - (a) who becomes a licensee of the Licence or
 - (b) who becomes entitled to:

 - (iii) any proceeds of sale of such petroleum

THE Licensee shall ensure that any mortgage or charge or encumbrance of any description or any rights in security of any description howsoever constituted or arising which directly or indirectly affects any right granted by the Licence or derived from any right so granted shall be and shall be expressed to be subject to the provisions of this deed.
- 9. IN the event of a licence being granted to the Licensee wholly or partly in substitution for or replacement of the Licence the terms of this deed shall apply to that licence as they apply to the Licence.
- 10. THE Licensee hereby acknowledges that its obligations under clauses 2 and 3 of this deed are owed to the Secretary of State and BNOC severally and that the performance of such obligations may be enforced accordingly AND it is further expressly agreed and acknowledged by and among all the parties hereto that the obligations of the Licensee hereunder can only be sufficiently performed and discharged in the manner herein specified and that performance or discharge by the Licensee in any other manner is not and will not be an adequate substitute.
- 11. THE rights and powers of the Secretary of State under this deed are additional to and their exercise shall not prejudice his rights and powers under the Licence or under any enactment.
- 12. IT is hereby further agreed and declared that any rights vested in BNOC pursuant to this deed may be assigned PROVIDED THAT:
 - (a) the written consent of the Secretary of State is first obtained:
 - (b) the assignment is made in writing;
 - (c) the assignment is made in favour of a state corporation; and
 - (d) written notice of the assignment is given to the Licensee.
- 13. THIS deed shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of [England and Wales] [Scotland] [Northern Ireland].

(Note. The governing law will be that applicable to the area in which the licensed area is situated)

SCHEDULE 3

Outline of the Arrangements and the Provisions, to be incorporated in Joint Operating Agreements at the appropriate Time, to obtain (secure access) for BNOC to a share of any petroleum produced under Seventh Round Licences.

The licensing arrangements are to provide that BNOC is to have secure access to up to 51% of any petroleum produced under Seventh Round licences. To achieve this, as soon as possible after the Licenses decides to proceed with development, BNOC is to become a co-licensee and a party to the Joint Operating Agreement (JOA) but with its rights and responsibilities limited to those necessary to

- 2. BNOC's right to acquire petroleum is to be expressed as an option to take up to 51% of the petroleum produced, the relevant percentage to be calculated after taking into account any petroleum required to be delivered to the Secretary of State as royalty in kind. Where the option is exercised BNOC is to pay market price for the petroleum it acquires it acquires.
- 3. When BNOC becomes a party to the JOA, the JOA is to be amended to express BNOC's right to petroleum and to provide for the exercise of the option. BNOC's involvement in JOA matters will be limited solely to those which are necessary for the efficient exercise of its right to petroleum as follows:
 - (a) BNOC will not have any rights in, and will not be involved in, licence operations concerning the exploration for petroleum or the appraisal prior to development of discoveries. BNOC will not be entitled to receive any information about such operations but is to be provided with information about development or

to be provided with information about development or production where such information is necessary in the context of its right to petroleum.

(b) BNOC will not be entitled to attend Committee meetings except where, and for such time as, matters relevant to its right to petroleum are being discussed. It will not have a vote on the Committee.

(c) BNOC will not contribute to the costs of licence activities and it is to be indemnified against any costs or claims for damages arising from such activities.

or claims for damages arising from such activities. BNOC will not, however, be indemnified from appropriate costs or claims relevant to agreed lifting procedures.

(d) Provision is to be made for BNOC's rights to be protected in the event of a change in licensees or the exercise of any legal charge over a licence interest.

exercise of any legal charge over a licence interest.

(e) Arrangements are to be incorporated in the JOA for the giving of notice for the exercise of the option, including the duration of the options and amounts, qualities and kinds of petroleum to be acquired by BNOC. The JOA will also define 'market price', establish the arrangements for price negotiations and include provision for recourse to an expert in the event of failure to agree on price.

The JOA will also include provision for the adjustment of payments (where appropriate) following price negotiations or settlement of disputes on 'market

negotiations or settlement of disputes on 'market price '.

- (f) If arrangements for the lifting, handling, and transport of petroleum cannot be finalised at the time development is decided upon, the amendments to the JOA will provide for a definitive agreement to be concluded at the appropriate time in conjunction with concluded at the appropriate time in conjunction with BNOC, subject always to such agreement being acceptable to the Secretary of State. It will include arrangements for the loading of tankers at offshore and onshore terminals. And it will ensure that to safeguard the efficient exercise of its options, BNOC is a party to, and is treated at all times on an equal footing to the equity holders on all matters relating to the lifting, handling, and transport of petroleum.
- 4. Further information about the giving of notice, the assessment of market price, and BNOC's limited rights to information are set out in the Annex hereto.
- 5. In cases where there is only one party on the licence and, consequently, no need for a comprehensive JOA to be prepared there shall, nonetheless, be an agreement safeguarding the right to acquire petroleum, as indicated above.
- 6. The above paragraphs give guidelines for the arrangements to apply where BNOC is not on the licence from the outset. Where BNOC is an equity partner, the Corporation will have rights and obligations in common

with its partners, save that BNOC's partners are to give the Corporation secure access to up to 51% of each partner's share of petroleum produced under the licence. In any case where the British Gas Comporation (BGC) or any of its wholly owned substrates is a co-licensee, provisions on the lines described in paragraphs 2 and 3 above are to provide that BNOC will have the right to acquire up to 51% of the share of petroleum accruing to each of BGC's partners in the licence.

ANNEX TO SCHEDULE 3

Election Notices, Assessment of Market Price for Petroleum, and BNOC's Rights to Information

Election Notices

Election Notices are to be served, in writing, by BNOC on each of its co-licensees not less than six months before the start of the Election Period to which they relate, and are to specify the proportion of each kind of petroleum which is to be taken by BNOC. The Election Period is to be the calendar year, save for the first such period. Failure by BNOC to serve an Election Notice shall constitute a waiver of BNOC's rights in respect of petroleum produced during the relevant Election Period.

Market Price

- 2. BNOC is to pay Market Price for any petroleum that it takes. Market Price means in respect of any grade of Crude Oil (or NGLs) the quarterly price per Barrel at which Crude Oil (or NGLs as appropriate) is being sold for the period in question at arms length in international trade on a term basis. In assessing the Price account shall be taken of sales for the grade in question, other UKCS grades and similar and other grades of Crude Oil (or NGLs as appropriate) from locations other than the UKCS (due allowance being made for quality and location), taking into account all relevant factors including but not limited to quality, quantity, method of delivery and transport and prevailing credit terms.
- 3. The procedures for establishing Market Price for crude oil shall include the following:
 - (a) BNOC is, prior to the quarter in which the petroleum is to be lifted, to advise its co-licensees of its proposed Market Price for that quarter.

(b) There shall be provision, in the event of failure to reach agreement, for the determination of the price to

be referred to an independent expert.

(c) If, after the Market Price has been agreed or determined a substantial and unforeseen change occurs in the price of Crude Oil as traded on a term basis internationally, it is to be possible for either BNOC or its co-licensees, to seek a review of the Market Price.

Information

4. BNOC's rights to information are to be limited solely to such information as is necessary in respect of its right to petroleum, that is reports, data, and information relating to production profiles, actual and estimated production, estimated reserves, quantities, qualities, transport, storage, facilities for delivery of petroleum, timing of dates of lifting and delivery, and of tanker movements, and anticipated delays or interruptions in production, and such other information as BNOC and the operator shall mutually agree to be necessary in respect of BNOC's right to petroleum.

- 5. BNOC shall be required to hold such information confidential in the same respects as its co-licensees.


