*West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council (Bradford)*  
*(Traffic Regulation) (No. 28) Order 1979*

Notice is hereby given that the West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council made the above Order on 8th July 1980 under the powers in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is to impose the following mandatory turns:

(1) *Left-Hand Turns*

- (a) Vehicles proceeding on Gilpin Street (towards Thursby Street) to turn left into Harewood Street;
- (b) Vehicles proceeding on Thursby Street (towards Gilpin Street) to turn left into Harewood Street.

(2) *Right-Hand Turns*

- (a) Vehicles proceeding on Harewood Street (in an easterly direction) to turn right into Thursby Street;
- (b) Vehicles proceeding on Harewood Street (in a westerly direction) to turn right into Gilpin Street.

An exemption is included for vehicles travelling on Gilpin Street or Harewood Street (in a westerly direction) entering the Leeds Road Hospital access road situate at the Harewood Street/Gilpin Street junction.

The Order comes into operation on 21st July 1980. A copy of the Order, which together with a map showing the restricted road and a statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined during normal office hours at the Reception Desk, Main Entrance, County Hall, Wakefield, and at the DoPET Traffic Unit, Princes House, Wardley Centre, Little Horton Lane, Bradford.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, or on the grounds that any requirements of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from the date upon which the Order was made (i.e. 8th July 1980), apply to the High Court for this purpose.

*The City Council of Lancaster Footpath 18 (part) Stopping-Up Order 1980*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 30th May 1980 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the City Council of Lancaster as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish the public right of way running along the south-eastern side of Westgate, Morecambe, in the county of Lancaster from a point adjacent to the junction of Westgate and White Lund Road to a point approximately sixty-five feet in a south-westerly direction.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment with the Order.

*Public Path Diversion Order 1980*
