WEST YORKSHIRE METROPOLITAN COUNTY COUNCIL

The West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council (Leeds) (Traffic Regulation) (No. 21) Order 1979

Cotswold District Council Public Footpath (BDU 8 Duntisbourne Abbots) Diversion Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 3rd July 1980, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Cotswold District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert a section of Public Footpath BDU 8 Duntisbourne Abbots commencing at a point A where it meets the unclassified county road and running to a point B at the boundary fence to the west of Whiteheads Well to a route commencing at the point B described above and running in a southerly direction following the western side of the boundary fence to a point C where it meets the unclassified county road.
