(iii) the words "Registered as a newspaper at the Post Office" printed or reproduced on it."

from the newspaper itself, it shall be sufficient if the heading "Supplement" and the whole or part of the title of the newspaper are printed or reproduced on one side of every sheet; and

(e) all sheets of the publication are put together in some one part of that issue of the newspaper, whether gummed or stitched up with the newspaper or not; and (f) the total area of its pages does not exceed the total area of the pages of a copy of the issue of the news-paper with which it is published."
