County of Avon (City of Bath) (Lower Bristol Road (A36), Roseberry Road, Bellotts Road) (Box Junction) Order 1980

AVON COUNTY COUNCIL

County of Avon (Clay Pit Road, Durdham Down, Bristol) (Prohibition of Right Turns) Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that on 7th August 1980, the County Council of Avon made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is to prohibit any vehicle proceeding in the roads specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this Notice to make a right turn into the road specified in relation to that road in column 2 of the said Schedule.

BURY METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Greater Manchester County (Victoria Lane, Whitefield) (Prohibition of Waiting) (Borough) Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Bury, pursuant to arrangements made with the County Council of Greater Manchester under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, have made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at all times on the north side of Victoria Lane, Whitefield, from a point 25 metres east of Jackson Street in a westerly direction to a point opposite the easterly kerb-line of Jackson Street. Gloucestershire County Council (Parish of Quedgeley) Stroud District) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1980

The Gloucestershire County Council propose to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended the effect of which will be to prohibit any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to proceed in the length of Class III road known as School Lane, Quedgeley, Stroud, as follows:

School Lane

North-west side, from a point 280 metres south-west of its junction with Courtfield Road for a distance of 90 metres in a westerly direction.

South-east side; from a point 300 metres south-west of its junction with Courtfield Road for a distance of 41 metres in a westerly direction.
