Notice is hereby given that on 30th September 1980, the Humberside County Council made that Order which will be operative from 6th October 1980, the effect of which will be that no vehicle shall:

- (b) wait between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive in parts of the following roads:

Chamberlain Road, Chapman Street, Clarence Street, Corporation Road, James Reckitt Avenue, Jenning Street, Lime Street, Lorraine Street, Mayville Avenue, Southcoates Lane, Stoneferry Road, St. Mark Street.

- (c) wait between the hours of 7 a.m. to 9.30 a.m. and 4 p.m. to 6.30 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive in parts of the following roads:

Cleveland Street, Great Union Street, New Cleveland Street, Stoneferry Road.

- (d) load or unload between the hours of 7 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and 4 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive in parts of the following roads:

Chapman Street, Clarence Street, Cleveland Street, Ferry Lane, Great Union Street, Hedon Road, New Cleveland Street, Sculcoates Bridge Approach, Southcoates Lane, Stoneferry Road.

Exemptions to (a), (b) and (c) above will include permission to wait for the purposes of picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading, for fire, police and ambulance services, and for the maintenance of roads and of gas, water and electricity supplies.

A copy of the Order and relevant map may be examined during normal office hours at the Administration Department, County Hall, Beverley (BAS/953(5)), and The Reception and Enquiries Office, Guildhall, Kingston-upon-Hull.

If you wish to question the validity of this Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from 30th September 1980, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
