

the whole of footpath No. 419040 in the Parish of Nether Wasdale to Skew Gill. (The right of way over the same general line will still be provided by footpaths Nos. 408078 and 419042.)

- (13) Over the whole of footpath No. 408083 in the Parish of Eskdale from Greta Gill running north-eastwards to the Parish boundary and continuing as the whole of footpath No. 419043 in the Parish of Nether Wasdale to its junction with footpath No. 419042 near Skew Gill. (The right of way over the same general line will still be provided by footpaths Nos. 408078 and 419042.)
- (14) Over 550 metres of footpath No. 419041 in the Parish of Nether Wasdale from its junction with footpath No. 419024 south-west of Bell Rib running north-eastwards to its next junction west of Broad Crag then 340 metres of footpath No. 419024 between Broad Crag and Long Crag and finally 130 metres of footpath No. 419041 north-east of Long Crag. (The right of way over the same route will still be provided by the unextinguished portions of these two footpaths.)
- (15) Over 1,170 metres of footpath No. 419016 in the Parish of Nether Wasdale from the waterfall on Over Beck, 300 metres north of Brimfull Beck, running north-eastwards to its junction with footpath No. 419024 at Dore Head. (The right of way will still be provided by footpath No. 419045 running approximately 200 metres away on the east side of Over Beck.)
- (16) Over 490 metres of footpath No. 542015 in the Parish of Grasmere from its junction near the Lion and Lamb running northwards and north-eastwards to the point where it re-joins the footpath west of Fairy Glen. (The right of way will still be provided by that part of footpath No. 542015 looping to the north of the Old Woman Playing the Organ.)
- (17) Over the northern branch of footpath No. 542012 in the Parish of Grasmere from near Easedale Tarn generally westwards to Codale Head and continuing as part of footpath No. 543019 in the Parish of Langdales to the top of Sergeant Man. (The right of way will still be provided by the southern branch of footpath No. 542012 and the eastern part of footpath No. 543019.)
- (18) Over the western branch of footpath No. 543018 in the Parish of Langdales from its junction with footpath No. 543014 north-east of Stickle Tarn north-north-eastwards across footpath No. 542012 and continuing as footpath No. 542013 in the Parish of Grasmere to its junction with the northern branch of footpath No. 542012. (The right of way will still be provided by footpaths Nos. 543018 and 543019 and part of 542012.)
- (19) Over 300 metres of footpath No. 543017 in the Parish of Langdales from the north side of Gimmer Crag to a point 150 metres east of Pike of Stickle. (The right of way between these points will still be provided by other branches of the same footpath.)
- (20) Over part of footpath No. 543014 in the Parish of Langdales from near Dungeon Ghyll Force generally north-westwards past Thorn Crag to its junction with footpath No. 543017 then north-eastwards to its junction with footpath No. 543016 north of Harrison Stickle and part of footpath No. 543017 from its junction with footpath No. 543014 north-west of Mark Gate generally north-westwards past Gimmer Crag to Pike of Stickle then eastwards to its junction with footpath No. 543014 south-west of Harrison Stickle, and to create new footpaths connecting the same points but avoiding difficult or dangerous ground.
- (21) Over the northern branch of footpath No. 543006 in the Parish of Langdales from its junction near Stool End Farm generally north-westwards passing north of Earing Crag to its junction with footpath No. 543008 on Bow Fell and over the whole of footpath No. 543007 from its junction with footpath No. 543005 near Three Tarns north-eastwards to Earing Crag. (The right of way over these routes will still be provided by the southern branch of footpath No. 543006.)

Copies of the Orders and maps showing the footpaths to be extinguished and also the new and existing footpaths which will give alternative access over the extinguished portions have been deposited and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the offices of the undersigned, The Courts, Carlisle and also at the offices of the County Highways Department, Kendal Green, Kendal.

Any representations or objections with respect to the Orders may be sent in writing to the County Solicitor, The

Courts, Carlisle to be received not later than 14th November 1980, and should state the particular Order or Orders upon which representation is made and the grounds upon which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Cumbria County Council may instead of submitting the Orders to the Secretary of State for the Environment themselves confirm the Orders or any of them. If any Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment any representations or objections relating thereto which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

Dacorum District Council (Footpath No. 1 Northchurch) Public Path Diversion Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 25th September 1980, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Dacorum District Council.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the Public Right of Way running from Little Heath Lane, Potten End, near Berkhamsted, in a north-westerly direction across lower Little Heath Farm, to the western boundary of that farm to a line running from the western boundary of Lower Little Heath Farm, along the western side of the western hedgeline of that farm in a south-westerly direction for approximately 11.2 metres then west-west-north for approximately 14.6 metres then south south-west for approximately 3.7 metres then south south-west for approximately 19.6 metres to meet the Little Heath Lane.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
