(2) The said twenty-one items of jewellery being imported goods chargeable on importation with customs or excise duty were

without payment of that duty removed from their place of importation on 18th May 1980.

(3) Or alternatively on 18th May 1980 John Albert James being a person entering the United Kingdom failed to declare at such place and in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise had directed the said twenty-one items of jewellery which were carried with him, and which being dutiable or chargeable goods he had obtained in the United Kingdom without payment of duty or tax and in respect of which he is not entitled to exemption from duty and tax by virtue of any order under section 13 of the Customs and Excise Duties (General Reliefs) Act 1979 (personal reliefs). Whereby and by force of sections 49 (1) and 78 (4) of the

Customs and Excise Management Act 1979 the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act specifying the name and address of a solicitor in England who is authorised to accept service of process and to act on your behalf. In default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.
