The effect of the first-mentioned Order made under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D of the Act is to revoke the existing Royal County of Berkshire (Various Roads—Shrivenham) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1970 and to re-enact the Order to the extent that it is not inconsistent with the new proposals; to extend the prohibition of waiting regulations to other parts of High Street and to impose new prohibition of waiting regulations in parts of Faringdon Road, Townsend Road, Highworth Road and on all sides of The Green. of The Green.
