The Mid Suffolk District Council (Finningham Footpath No. 14) Public Path Diversion Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that on 18th September 1980 the Mid Suffolk District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed is to divert the following public right of way:

Finningham footpath No. 14, which commences at the north-western corner of O.S. Field No. 267 and runs in a generally easterly direction across O.S. Field No. 267 to its eastern boundary at a point approximately 15 metres from its north-eastern corner for a distance of approximately 125 metres, to a line running as follows:

A path 1.2 metres wide commencing at the north-western corner of O.S. Field No. 267 and running in an easterly direction along the northern headland of O.S. Field No. 267 to its north-eastern corner for a distance of approximately 125 metres.

North Cornwall District Council Bude Footpath No. 38 Public Path Diversion Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 3rd October 1980, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the North Cornwall District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert part of the footpath so that instead of proceeding over land forming part of the golf course, Bude for a distance of approximately 140 metres, to join Burn View at a point opposite its junction with Princes Street the path will proceed over land forming part of the golf course, Bude for a distance of approximately 120 metres in a generally south-westerly direction to meet Burn View at a point approximately mid-way between its junction with Princes Street and its junction with Lansdown Road.
