ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

The Essex County Council (Various Roads, Halstead) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that on 9th October 1980 the Essex County Council made the above-named Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967.

The effect of the Order, which will come into operation on 22nd October 1980, will be to impose the following waiting restrictions at Halstead:

Waiting to be Prohibited at All Times

Elizabeth Way, both sides, from its junction with Hedingham Road (A604) for a distance of 15 metres.

Hedingham Road (A604), south-west side, from its junction with Box Mill Lane south-eastwards for a distance of 34 metres.

Colne Road, both sides, from its junction with Head Street (A131) south-eastwards for a distance of 15 metres.

Sudbury Road (A131), east side, from its junction with Colne Road north-eastwards for a distance of 15 metres.

Waiting to be Prohibited between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays inclusive

Butler Road, both sides, from a point 13.7 metres north-west of its junction with Trinity Street north-westwards for a distance of 20 metres.

Parsonage Street, north-east side, from a point 55 metres north-west of its junction with Malloes Field to a point 43 metres north-west of that junction.

Exceptions in the Order will permit waiting for the purposes of:

- picking up or setting down passengers;
- loading or unloading goods;

and, where necessary, in connection with:

- the maintenance of the roads;
- the supply of gas, electricity and water; and
- the maintenance of Post Office services.

A copy of the Order and relevant maps are available at County Hall, Chelmsford where they may be examined during normal office hours from Mondays to Fridays.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any instrument made under it,

has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from 9th October 1980, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

Mid Glamorgan County Council (Whitcombe Street, Aberdare) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the Mid Glamorgan County Council propose to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time, with the exception of hackney carriages standing for hire, on the western side of Whitcombe Street, Aberdare from its junction with Canon Street northwards to the common boundary of Nos. 27-28 Whitcombe Street, a distance of 28 metres (31 yards).

Exemptions will also be provided in the Order for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and roadworks, the maintenance of essential services, weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge will be allowed to wait for up to 2 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour.

A copy of the proposed Order, a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, and a map showing the side of length of road to which the proposed Order relates may be inspected at the offices of the Cynon Valley Borough Council, Rock Grounds, High Street, Aberdare, and at the Mid Glamorgan County Hall, Cathays Park, Cardiff during normal office hours.

Objections to the proposal, together with the grounds on which they are made must be sent in writing to the undersigned by 10th November 1980.
