The Folkestone—Honiton Trunk Road (A27) (Old Shoreham Road De-Trunking) Order 198

The Folkestone-Honiton Trunk Road (A27 Brighton By-Pass Side Roads) Order 198

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

1. an Order under section 7 of the Highways Act 1959

which will:

(a) provide that a length of the A27 Principal Road (known locally as Lewes Road), in East Sussex, between the Southern Water Authority Offices and Depot, east of Coldean and the Brighton Borough Council boun-dary with Lewes District Council, west of Falmer, shall become a trunk road as from the date when the Order comes into operation; and

(b) provide that roads which he proposes to construct along the following routes shall become trunk roads as from the date when the Order comes into operation:

(i) a route (the main route) about 8½ miles (14 kilometres) in length between Kingston-by-Sea in West Sussex and east of Coldean in East Sussex, passing to the north of Mile Oak, Hangleton, West Blatchington, Westdene, Coney Hill and Patcham and north-east of Coldean;

(ii) routes for slip roads to connect the main route with existing roads at West Blatchington, Patcham, Old Boat Corner and Coldean;

(iii) routes for slip roads to connect the main route with a highway proposed to be constructed at Hangleton (the Hangleton Link Road), in pursuance of the side roads Order referred to hereafter;

(iv) a route for a link road to connect sections of the A27 Trunk Road at Kingston-by-Sea;

(v) a route for a link road (with roundabouts) to connect the slip roads mentioned at (ii) above at Patcham with the A23 Trunk Road;

(vi) a route to connect the A23 Trunk Road with the route mentioned at (v) above at Patcham; and

(vii) a route to connect the highway described at (a) above with the A27 Principal Road (known locally as Lewes Road) at Coldean.

 an Order under section 7 of the Highways Act 1959 will provide that that length of the A27 Folkestone— Honston Trunk Road (known locally as Old Shoreham Honiton Trunk Road (known locally as Old Shoreham Road), commencing at and including the roundabout (known locally as the Kingston roundabout) at its junction with Upper Shoreham Road at Kingston-by-Sea, West Sussex, eastwards to its junction with Hangleton Road and Carlton Terrace at Portslade-by-Sea, Hove, East Sussex, to be superseded by the new trunk road on the main route mentioned at sub-paragraph 1 (b) (i) above, shall cease to be a trunk road and shall be classified as provided in the Order as from the date be classified as provided in the Order, as from the date on which the Minister notifies the County Councils of East Sussex and West Sussex (who will become the highway authorities responsible for the lengths respectively within their boundaries) that the said new trunk road is open for through traffic; and

(d) to stop up private means of access to premises; and

(e) to provide new means of access to premises, all between Kingston-by-Sea, West Sussex and west of Falmer, East Sussex on or in the vicinity of the route of the new trunk road on the main route mentioned
