2A(2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:
(a) a disabled person's badge in the relevant posi-

tion, when:

- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the observe side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen;
- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle; and
- (b) a parking disc in the relevant position, when the disc is exhibited with the side which shows the time facing forwards or outwards, and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.
- 2. In Article 4, after paragraph (d) there shall be inserted the following paragraph:
