Notice is hereby given that on 20th October 1980 the above Order was made by the Eastleigh Borough Council pursuant to arrangements with the Hampshire County Council under sections 1, 28, 31 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended.

The Order will consolidate the existing prohibitions and restrictions for vehicles waiting in the town centre area and introduce certain new provisions of a similar

kind.

When this Order comes into effect on 3rd November 1980 you will not be allowed to leave your vehicles:

(a) at any time in certain parts of the following roads in the Borough of Eastleigh:

Barton Road Bishopstoke Road Blenheim Road Campbell Road Chamberlayne Road Cherbourg Road Chestnut Avenue Cranbury Road The Crescent Derby Road Desborough Road Dutton Lane Factory Road Grantham Road High Street Leigh Road Market Street Nutbeem Road Romsey Road

Southampton Road Toynbee Road

Twyford Road
The rear service road off the northern side of Factory Road between Street and High Street. The link road at the rear of properties in Southampton Road from Blenheim Road to Factory Road, The rear service road off the northern side of Factory Road between Southampton Road and Market Street. The rear service road off the northern side of Factory Road between High Street and Desborough Road.

(b) between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays in certain lengths of the following roads in the Borough of Eastleigh:

Archers Road Cranbury Road The Crescent Factory Road George Street Laburnum Grove Newtown Road Northlands Road Nutbeem Road Romsey Close Salisbury Close Weston Road

(c) between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays in a part of Bishopstoke Road and Barton Road.

In parts of Blenheim Road, Derby Road, Factory Road, High Street and Market Street waiting will be permitted for 30 minutes in any period of one hour.

In parts of the following roads parking will be permitted for one hour in any period of two hours:

Archers Road Blenheim Road Chamberlayne Road Cranbury Road The Crescent Derby Road Desborough Road Factory Road

George Street Grantham Road High Street Market Street Newtown Road Northlands Road Weston Road

Residents' vehicles displaying a parking permit issued by the Borough Council will be exempt from the restrictions imposed by paragraph 5 above.

Certain vehicles being used by disabled persons will be permitted to wait for a limited period in the lengths of roads referred to in paragraph 3 and will be permitted to wait in the lengths of roads referred to in paragraphs 4 and 5

Exemptions will in any event permit waiting for the purposes of:

(a) picking up and setting down passengers;

(b) loading and unloading goods;(c) the maintenance of the roads;

(d) the supply of gas, water and electricity; and (e) statutory duties.

Full details of these proposals together with a map showing the restricted areas may be examined at my office at the Civic Offices, Leigh Road, Eastleigh during normal office hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or any of the provisions contained in the Order on the grounds that it is not within the powers of sections 1, 28, 31 and 84D of the Road Traffic Act 1967 as amended or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order is made make applica-tion to the High Court for this purpose.

The proposed scale of charges is:

10p for up to and including one hour 20p for between one and two hours 30p for between two and four hours 40p for between four and ten hours. Excess charge £6.

Quarterly parking permits will be available at a cost of £18.

Charges shall not apply to vehicles displaying a current disabled persons badge.

All classes of vehicles with the exception of those with an unladen weight in excess of 30 cwt or exceeding 2.05 metres in height will be permitted to use the parking places.
