COMPENSATION FOR AIRCRAFT AND SHIPBUILDING INDUSTRIES

On behalf of Her Majesty's Treasury the Bank of England announce that, in accordance with the Aircraft and Shipbuilding Industries Act 1977 an issue of about £4.08 million of 10 per cent Exchequer Stock 1983 was made on 20th October as compensation due in respect of the unquoted securities of Yarrow (Shipbuilders) Limited and Yarrow (Training) Limited.

This follows the announcement on 14th October 1980, by the Department of Industry and the Stockholders' Representative that compensation had been agreed.

The issue of 10 per cent Exchequer Stock 1983 was made at the rate of £100 Exchequer Stock per £92 $\frac{7}{16}$ compensation.

A special interest payment will be made covering the period from 1st July 1977 to 12th June 1980.

Stock issued on 20th October will rank for a full six months' interest on 12th December 1980. Dealings in the stock were permitted from 21st October 1980 and the stock will not be distinguished from 10 per cent Exchequer Stock 1983 in existence before that date.

NOISE INSULATION REGULATIONS 1973

M3 Frimley-Lightwater

The Frimley-Lightwater Improvement was opened to traffic on 18th June 1971. Offers of insulation (double windows, and perhaps doors, special ventilation and in some cases venetian blinds) or grant were subsequently made to the occupiers (and/or landlords) of all dwellings which were believed to qualify under the Noise Insulation Provide the Computations 1972. which were believed to qualify under the Noise Insulation Regulations 1973.
