North side, from a point 10 metres south-west of the Hawker Siddeley Works Car Park entrance to a point 135 metres south-west of Bolton Road.

The Order contains exemptions to permit waiting for the purposes of boarding or alighting, loading or unloading, funerals, building operations or work on or under the length of road. Disabled persons' vehicles bearing a disabled person's badge and parking disc may wait for periods of up to 2 hours, return prohibited within 1 hour.

A copy of the Order, which comes into operation on 3rd November 1980, and a map showing the roads to which it relates, may be inspected between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays at:
