This Order becomes operative as from 24th October 1980 but if any person is aggrieved by the Order and desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 within 6 weeks from 24th October 1980 make application for the purpose to the High Court.

Designation of Conservation Areas

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 as substituted by section 1 of the Town and Country Amenities Act 1974 that the Worcester City Council after consultation with the County Council of Hereford and Worcester have determined that the areas described in the Schedule to this Notice are areas of special architectural or historic interest, the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance, and have accordingly designated the said areas as conservation areas.

The effect of the designation of a conservation area may be summarised as follows:

- (a) Where any application for planning permission for development of land in or adjacent to a conservation area is made to the Council and the development would, in the opinion of the council, affect the character or appearance of the conservation area, the application will be subject to the special procedure in section 28 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 as amended.
- (b) Anyone wishing to demolish a building or a part of a building situate within a conservation area must first apply for consent to demolition to the local planning authority. This is not taken to be included in a planning permission for re-development of the site unless, in granting the planning permission, the authority states that it includes consent to demolish the building. Some buildings may be exempt from this requirement.
- (c) Anyone wishing to cut down, top, lop or uproot a tree situate within a conservation area must give six weeks prior notice of his attention to the local planning authority.

Maps of the conservation areas may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the office of the City Architect and Planning Officer at Hylton Road, Worcester, or at the office of the Chief Executive and Town Clerk of Worcester City Council.

Public Path Diversion Order, 1980*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 24th October 1980 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Borough Council of Bolton as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way known as Footpath 161 Horwich, at Wilderswood Farm Horwich as runs from Point A on the map in a northerly direction to point D, to a line running from point A, to point B, to point C, to point D.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Borough Council of Bolton may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations or objections duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

Chiltern District Council (Footpath No. 23, Cholesbury-Cum-St. Leonards) Public Path Diversion Order 1980.

Notice is hereby given that on 14th October 1980 the Chiltern District Council confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert that section of Footpath No. 23 at Cholesbury commencing at point 'F' on the plan (Map Ref. 929807) for 42 metres east-south-east to point 'D' then 60 metres south-east to point 'C', then north-east and north for 230 metres along the outer bank of the circular dry moat to point 'B' to a line commencing from point 'L', 13 metres south of point 'F' for 24 metres east-north-east to point 'K' then following the original path line for 16 metres to point 'J', then for 50 metres east-south-east to point 'I' on the inner bank of the circular dry moat and curving north-east and north for 164 metres to point 'H', and then crossing the moat to point 'B' where it joins Footpath No. 23A.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at Elmodesham House, 42 High Street, Amersham, Buckinghamshire, during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from 31st October 1980, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order, he may under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act within 6 weeks from 31st October 1980, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
