TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 209 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise the stopping up of the highways described in the Schedule to this notice to enable development to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted under Part III of that Act.

Within the above-mentioned period of 28 days any person may by notice to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office, Transport and Highways Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL (quoting Ref. WR15/34/14 Part 2), object to the making of the Order, stating the grounds for objection.

SCHEDULE

(All distances are approximate)

The highways to be stopped up are at Newport in the county of Gwent and are:

- (a) that length of Courtybella Terrace which extends from its junction with Arthur Street in a general south-easterly direction to a point 31 yards south-east of its junction with Price Street; and
- (b) that length of Courtybella Terrace which extends from a point 11 yards north-west of its junction with Lime Street to a point 3 yards north-west of its junction with Jeddo Street. (10 SI)

The highway to be stopped up is at Mountain Ash in the Borough of Cynon Valley in the county of Mid Glamorgan and is that length of Cardiff Road which extends from a point 5 yards from the nearest point to the junction with New Road (A4059) in general north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 722 yards.
