The Newham (Prescribed Route) (No.) Traffic Order 198

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council propose to make the above-mentioned Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Road Traffic Act 1974.

2. The general effect of the Order would be to impose one-way working for vehicular traffic in Chestnut Avenue between Woodford Road and Avenue Road from south-west to north-east.

3. Exemption would be provided in the Order in respect of anything done:

- (a) with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform;
- (b) in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.

4. A copy of the proposed Order, and of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the expiration of a period of 21 days from the date on which this notice is published in Room B21, The County Hall, London SE1 7PB.

6. Any person desiring to object to the proposed Order should send a statement in writing of his objection and the grounds thereof to the Controller of Planning and Transportation, The County Hall, London SE1 7PB, quoting the reference PT/TD/O/LS, within the afore-mentioned period of 21 days.

The Sutton (Prescribed Routes) (No. 2) Traffic Order 1980

The Sutton (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 14) Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council on 27th October 1980 made the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Road Traffic Act 1974.

2. The general effect of the Sutton (Prescribed Routes) (No. 2) Traffic Order 1980, will be to impose one-way working for vehicular traffic in:

- (a) *The Quadrant*, in a general clockwise direction.
- (b) *Wellesley Road*, the south-western arm, between The Quadrant and Brighton Road, in a general south-westerly direction.

3. The one-way workings referred to in paragraph 2 above will not apply in respect of anything done:

- (a) with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform;
- (b) in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.

4. The general effect of the Sutton (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 14) Order 1980 will be further to amend the Sutton (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976, so that in The Quadrant:

- (a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) will be prohibited between 8.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive;

(b) waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle for a period of more than 20 minutes in the same place will be prohibited between 11 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive;

(c) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle will be prohibited between 11 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected;

(d) the use of any vehicle or of any animal or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume, wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising, will be prohibited.

5. The prohibitions referred to in paragraph 4 (a) and (b) above will not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or in certain circumstances, e.g., the picking up or setting down of passengers; the carrying out of statutory powers or duties; the taking in of petrol, etc., from roadside petrol stations. The usual exemption relating to vehicles displaying a disabled person's "Orange Badge" will apply.

6. A copy of each of the Orders, which will come into operation on 3rd November 1980, and of the Sutton (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 (and of the Orders which have previously amended that Order) can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders were made in Room B21, The County Hall, London SE1 7PB.

7. Copies of the Orders may be obtained from the Department of Planning and Transportation, Room 576, Main Building, The County Hall, London SE1 7PB.

8. Any person desiring to question the validity of either of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 or on the ground that any requirement of those sections of the Act or of section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act or of any regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to either of the Orders may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

The Bromley (Prescribed Route) (No.) Traffic Order 198

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council propose to make the above-mentioned Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Road Traffic Act 1974.

2. The effect of the Order would be to impose one-way working for vehicular traffic from south to north in Pines Road, between the north-eastern kerb-lines of Bickley Park Road and a point 14 metres north of those kerb-lines.

3. Exemption would be provided in the Order in respect of anything done:

- (a) with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform;
- (b) in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.
