The proposed footpath to extend for a total length of 82 yards, from the existing garage service road at the northern boundary of number 19 Shrewsbury Road and run east then north to the south-east corner of number 140 Brentford Avenue.

of bin stores, and proceeding in an easterly, then north-easterly direction across the open grassed area and terminating at the top of the existing steps.

Part II. Description of site of alternative footpath

The proposed footpath to extend for a total length of 57.4 yards from the aligned south-eastern corner of the eastern boundary wall of Torrige Way flats where it meets the existing footpath and proceeding north, north-east, and then in an easterly direction and terminating at the top of the existing steps.
