## NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

## TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

*West Wiltshire District Council (Footpath No. 9 Melksham)  
Public Path Stopping-Up Order 1980*

Notice is hereby given that on 29th October 1980 the West Wiltshire District Council confirmed the above-named Order. The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is:

- (a) to stop up the length of footpath No. 9 at Ruskin Avenue, Melksham running from point Y southwards for a distance of approximately 30 metres to point Z, as shown by a blue line on the plan attached to the Order.
- (b) to stop up the length of unnumbered footpath running from point X south-westwards for a distance of 40 metres to point A and then southwards for a distance of 50 metres to point C, as shown by a broken blue line on the plan attached to the Order.
- (c) to provide a new length of path joining the existing path No. 9 at point Y and running eastwards for a distance of 50 metres along the route Y-A-B, as shown by a red line on the plan attached to the Order.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Bradley Road, Trowbridge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

The Order becomes operative as from the date when the alternative route referred to has been created to the reasonable satisfaction of the Highway Authority, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Act, within 6 weeks from 7th November 1980 make an application for the purpose to the High Court.
