The West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council (Leeds)
(Traffic Regulation) (No. 23) Order 1979

Notice is hereby given that the West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council have made the above Order under their powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended.

The effect of the Order, which comes into force on 30th November 1980, is:

- (a) to prohibit waiting by vehicles at all times and to prohibit loading/unloading between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays in lengths of Wormald Row at Leeds;
- (b) to revise the Disabled Persons parking place in Wormald Row, Leeds (North Side).

A copy of the Order, which contains the usual exceptions, together with a map showing the extent of the restrictions may be examined during normal office hours at the Reception Desk, at the main entrance to the County Hall, Wakefield, and at the DOPET Traffic Unit, 5th Floor East, Merrion House, Merrion Way, Leeds.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, or on the grounds that any requirements of that Act or of any instruments made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from the date upon which the Order was made (i.e. 28th October 1980) apply to the High Court for this purpose.

Borough Council of Wellingborough Conservation Areas at Finedon and Grendon

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, as amended by section 1 of the Town and Country Amenities Act 1974, that the Borough Council of Wellingborough after consultation with the Northamptonshire County Council have determined that the areas described in the Schedule to this notice are areas of special architectural or historic interest, the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance and have accordingly designated the said areas as Conservation Areas.

The effect of the designation of the Conservation Areas may be summarised as follows:

- (a) where any application for planning permission for development of land in or adjacent to the Conservation Areas is made to the Council and the development would, in the opinion of the Council, affect the character or appearance of the Conservation Areas, the application will be subject to the special procedure in section 28 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, as amended;
- (b) anyone wishing to demolish a building or a part of a building situate within the Conservation Areas must first apply for consent to demolition to the local planning authority. This is not taken to be included in a planning permission for redevelopment of the site unless, in granting the planning permission, the authority states that it includes consent to demolish the building. Some buildings may be exempt from this requirement;
- (c) anyone wishing to cut down, top, lop or uproot a tree situate within the Conservation Areas must give 6 weeks prior notice of his intention to the local planning authority.

Maps of the Conservation Areas may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the office of the County Planning Officer at Northampton House, Northampton or at the office of the undersigned at the Council Offices, Swanspool, Wellingborough.
