Notice is hereby given that on 23rd October 1980 the Cotswold District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert a section of Public Footpath BDR 4 Duntisbourne Rouse, Gloucestershire, running from a point A at the west of St. Michael's Church to a point B in Field Parcel O.S. 66 at the north-west corner of the boundary of Field Parcel O.S. 67, to a route running from point A described above, to a point on the northern boundary of the Churchyard and thereafter along the western boundary of Field Parcel O.S. 67 to the point B described above.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, 5 Dyer Street, Cirencester, Gloucestershire during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from 20th November 1980, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act within 6 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

*Notice of Application to Stop up a Highway*

Notice is hereby given that whereas by Agreements dated 1st April 1974 and 21st July 1976 pursuant to section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, the Kent County Council (the County Council), the highway authority, arranged with the Dover District Council (the District Council) for the District Council to discharge on behalf of the County Council certain functions relating to highways including, inter alia, the exercise of the powers contained in section 108 of the Highways Act 1959.

Now, therefore take notice that the District Council pursuant to the aforementioned Agreements and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf intend to apply to the Magistrates' Court sitting at the Guildhall, Sandwich, Kent, on Friday, 12th December 1980, at 10.30 a.m. in the forenoon for:

1. An Order that the highway known as Queen Street, Dover, Kent, for a distance of 12.5 metres in an easterly direction from its junction with York Street, Dover, be authorised to be stopped up on the ground that it is unnecessary, and
2. An Order that the highway known as Queen Street Lane, Dover, Kent, for a distance of 18.5 metres in a northerly direction from its junction with Queen Street, Dover, be authorised to be stopped up on the ground that it is unnecessary.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
