The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public right of way running from the south-western corner of Statenborough Cottage, Sandwich Road, Eastry, along the south-western boundary of the said property, to Sandwich Road, to a line running from the south-western corner of O.S. parcel No. 5660, along the south-western boundary of the said parcel, to Sandwich Road.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1959*Borough of Kettering UA2, Burton Latimer (Public Path Diversion Order), 1980*

Notice is hereby given that on 28th October 1980, the Administrative Council of the Borough of Kettering confirmed the above Order.

To divert for a distance of approximately 182 metres in a generally southerly direction the public right of way known as UA2 which runs through the premises of Weetabix Limited in Burton Latimer in the county of Northampton, and the new route will run over the land described in the said Order.

*The Tyne and Wear County Council (Longbenton) Public Path Creation Order 1980 Tyne and Wear County Council Footpath No. 12 (Longbenton) Extinguishment Order 1980.*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Orders made on 4th November 1980, are about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, or to be confirmed as unopposed Orders by Tyne and Wear County Council.

The effect of the first-named Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to create a new public footpath running from a point on footpath 12, 14 metres east of Ashcroft Drive and 40 metres north of the rapid transit railway line in an easterly direction for 60 metres towards the north side of the new underpass. The path will proceed through the underpass and from the south side of the underpass will proceed in a south-south-westerly direction for 78 metres to meet footpath 12 just north of the British Rail lines. The effect of the second named order will be to extinguish the public right of way over that part of footpath No. 12 between the points linked by the new length of footpath described above.

A copy of the orders and the maps contained in them has been deposited and may be inspected at my office between the hours of 8.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. Monday to Thursday and 8.30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Friday and at the Public Library, Whitfield Road, Forest Hall, during its usual opening hours.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, Tyne and Wear County Council may instead of submitting the Orders to the Secretary of State themselves confirm the Orders. If the Orders are submitted to the Secretary of State any representations which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Orders.
