##### NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

##### *Borough of Macclesfield*

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 209 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 and all other powers enabling him in that behalf has made an Order entitled "The Macclesfield Borough Council (Footpaths Nos. 60 (part) and 63 (part) Mobblerley), Public Path Diversion Order 1980.

The effect of which will be to divert:

1. That part of Footpath No. 63 Mobblerley which runs from its junction with Footpath No. 60 Mobblerley in a south-westerly direction for approximately 270 metres, marked as line (1) on the map contained in the Order, on to a new line commencing at the said junction of Footpaths 63 and 60 Mobblerley and running in a generally south-westerly direction for approximately 275 metres and then in a south-easterly direction for approximately 20 metres to rejoin Footpath No. 63 Mobblerley, marked as line (A) on the map;

2. That part of Footpath No. 60 Mobblerley which runs from its junction with Footpath No. 63 Mobblerley in a south-easterly direction for approximately 140 metres, marked as line (2) on the map contained in the Order, on to new lines—

(a) Commencing at a point some 270 metres south-west of the junction of Footpaths 63 and 60 Mobblerley and running in a south-easterly direction for approximately 110 metres, and then in a north-easterly direction for approximately 310 metres to a point on Footpath No. 60 Mobblerley some 140 metres south-east of the junction of Footpaths 63 and 60 Mobblerley, marked as line (B) on the map, and,

(b) Commencing at the said junction of Footpaths 63 and 60 Mobblerley and running in a north-easterly then south-westerly direction for approximately 390 metres to a point on Footpath No. 60 Mobblerley, some 140 metres south-east of the junction of Footpaths 63 and 60 Mobblerley, marked as line (C) on the map.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the Macclesfield Borough Council, King Edward Street, Macclesfield and at Knutsford Service Centre, Council Offices, Toft Road, Knutsford and may be inspected free of charge at the council offices during normal office hours. The Order becomes operative as from the date of publication of this notice but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the making of the Order, he may, under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
