Notice is hereby given that the Blackburn Borough Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the County Council of Lancashire, in exercise of the powers of the said County Council propose to make an Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 of the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which will be to prohibit the driving of motor vehicles in the lengths of roads set out in the Schedule hereto.

Certain exemptions will apply, including (inter alia) provision to allow access to the properties in the roads and to allow access to off street garaging.

Full details of these proposals are in the draft Order which, together with a plan showing the restricted areas and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined at my office during normal office hours.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order, you should send the grounds for your objection in writing to me by 4th December 1980.

## BRIGHTON BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Brighton (Various Roads) (Experimental Prohibition of Driving) Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that on 6th November 1980 the Brighton Borough Council, acting as agents for the East Sussex County Council, made the above Experimental Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972.

The effect of the Order, which will come into operation on 15th November 1980 will cause for a period of 6 months from this date, no person to drive a vehicle in Cranbourne Street, Farmyard, or that part of Duke Street which extends from its junction with West Street eastwards to its junction with Middle Street on any Saturday between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. The nine 2 hour parking meter bays in the length of Duke Street to which this Order relates will be suspended during the whole of each Saturday, and to facilitate deliveries to shops in affected streets the prohibition on waiting for loading and unloading vehicles now in force between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. in West Street will no longer apply on Saturdays in two 70 foot lengths of the road, extending southwards from the northern kerb-line of Duke Street on the east side of the road and extending southwards from the northern kerb-line of Cranbourne Street on the west side of the road.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the roads affected may be examined at the Enquiry Office, Town Hall, Brighton, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provisions contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, or, on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made under it has not

been complied within relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from 6th November 1980 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

#### CORNWALL COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Cornwall (St. Martin Village) (Restricted Roads No. 8) Order 1980

Notice is herby given that the Council propose to make an Order to impose a speed limit of 30 m.p.h. on the following lengths of road at St. Martin Village in the parish of St. Martin-in-Meneage:

### DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Devon (St. Dominic's Close, St. Marychurch, Torquay) (Prohibition and Limitation of Waiting) Order 1980.
