NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

The Tonbridge and Malling District Council (Footpaths Nos. 96 (Part) and 135 (Part) Leybourne) Public Path Diversion Order 1980.

Notice is hereby given that on 10th November 1980 the Tonbridge and Malling District Council confirmed the above-named Order without modification.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to:

- (a) divert that length of Footpath No. 96 commencing at a point approximately 160 metres along the route of the footpath from its junction with Castle Way, Leybourne (described as "Point A" on the map contained in the Order) and leading in a generally east north-easterly direction for approximately 332 metres to a new route commencing at point A and leading in a generally north north-easterly direction for approximately 23 metres to point B; thence in a generally easterly direction for approximately 14 metres to point C; thence in a generally east north-easterly direction for approximately 333 metres to point D, where the existing route of Footpath 96 is rejoined and continues to point E at Rectory Lane;
- (b) divert that length of Footpath No. 135 commencing at a point approximately 222 metres along the route of the footpath from its junction with Castle Way, Leybourne (described as "Point F" on the map contained in the Order) and leading in a generally east south-easterly direction for approximately 353 metres to a new route commencing at point F and leading in a generally north-easterly direction for approximately 20 metres to point G; thence in a generally south-easterly direction for approximately 40 metres to point H; thence in a generally easterly direction for approximately 54 metres to point I; thence in a generally south-easterly direction for approximately 298 metres to point J, where the existing route of Footpath 135 is rejoined and continues to point K at the junction of Rectory Lane with London Road; and
- (c) require a defined minimum width of 2 metres along those sections to be diverted in accordance with the above.

A copy of the confirmed order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of Tonbridge and Malling District Council, The Air Station, West Malling, Kent and Tonbridge Castle, Tonbridge, Kent, and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

The Council of the City of Wakefield, The City of Wakefield (Crigglestone No. 6) Public Path Diversion Order 1980.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 30th April 1980, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Council of the City of Wakefield.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public right of way running from Point A on the Order map (grid reference 3122/1665) Westward for 65 yards to Point B (grid reference 3116/1667) to a line running from Point A to Point C (grid reference 3121/1662) and thence to Point B a distance of 125 yards.
