

GWENT COUNTY COUNCIL

The Gwent County Council (Blaencyffin Road and High Street, Llanhilleth) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting Order) 1980

Notice is hereby given that the Gwent County Council in exercise of their powers under sections 1 (1), (2), (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended and, by all other powers them enabling in that behalf propose to make an Order the effect of which will be:

1. To prohibit waiting at all times on those lengths of roads as set out in Schedule 1 to this Order.
2. To prohibit waiting between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on those lengths of road as set out in Schedule 2 to this Order.

Full details of these proposals are in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the restricted areas and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined at the offices of the Blaenau Gwent Borough Council, Civic Centre, Ebbw Vale and at the offices of the Gwent County Council, County Hall, Cwmbran, during normal office hours Monday to Friday.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order you should send the grounds for your objection in writing to the undersigned by 8th December 1980.

SCHEDULE 1

1. Blaencyffin Road

- (a) South-west side from its junction with High Street for a distance of 135 metres.
- (b) North-east side from its junction with High Street for a distance of 55 metres.
- (c) North-east side from its junction with the south-western kerb-line of Maes-y-cnyw Terrace access for a distance of 6 metres in a south-easterly direction.

2. High Street

- (a) North-east side from a point 18 metres in a south-easterly direction from the junction with Blaencyffin Road for a distance of 25 metres in a south-easterly direction.

SCHEDULE 2

Blaencyffin Road

- (a) West side from a point 135 metres from its junction with High Street for a distance of 100 metres in a general northerly direction.
- (b) North-east side from a point 6 metres in a south-easterly direction from the south-western kerb-line of Maes-y-cnyw Terrace access for a distance of 41 metres in a south-easterly direction.
- (c) East side from the north-eastern kerb-line of Maes-y-cnyw Terrace access for a distance of 114 metres in a general northerly direction.

Gwent County Council (Kensington Place and Other Roads, Newport) (Experimental) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting Order) 1980

Notice is hereby given that the Gwent County Council, in exercise of their powers under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 (which said Act of 1967, as so amended, is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967") and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf and, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with section 84C (1) have on 17th November 1980 made the above Order the effect of which will be:

1. To prohibit waiting at all times on those lengths of roads as set out in Schedule 1 to this Order for a period of six months from the date of commencement of the Order.
2. To prohibit waiting at all times on any day other than a Sunday on that length of road as set out in Schedule 2 to this Order for a period of six months from the date of commencement of the Order.
3. Exemptions have been included in the Order to permit waiting for the purposes of:
 - (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
 - (b) loading or unloading goods;
 - (c) delivery or collection of postal packets;

- (d) the maintenance of the road;
- (e) the supply of gas, water, electricity and of any telegraphic line;
- (f) in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (g) disabled persons parking;
- (h) police, fire brigade and ambulance services;
- (i) a funeral.

4. The Order shall come into operation on 1st December 1980.
5. The Order and the map showing the affected roads may be inspected at the County Hall, Cwmbran, during normal office hours (Monday to Friday only).
6. If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended; or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may within 6 weeks from 17th November 1980, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

SCHEDULE 1

No Waiting at any Time

(a) Kensington Place

- (i) South-east side from a point 15 metres from the north-east kerb-line of A48 Chepstow Road to a point 12 metres north-east of the north-east kerb-line of St. Johns Road.
- (ii) South-east side from the south-west kerb-line of Oaklands Road for a distance of 6 metres in a south-westerly direction.

(b) St. Johns Road

- (i) South-west side from the south-east kerb-line of Kensington Place for a distance of 18 metres.
- (ii) North-east side from the south-east kerb-line of Kensington Place for a distance of 23 metres.

(c) Oaklands Road

- (i) South-west side from the south-east kerb-line of Kensington Place for a distance of 7 metres.

SCHEDULE 2

No Waiting at any Time, Monday to Saturday

(a) Kensington Place

- (i) South-east side from a point 12 metres north-east of the north-east kerb-line of St. Johns Road to a point 6 metres south-west of the south-west kerb-line of Oaklands Road.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The Gwent County Council (Route A4049, Pontllanfraith—New Tredegar Road) (60 m.p.h. Speed Limit) (No. 1) Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the Gwent County Council hereby give notice that they propose, subject to the consent of the Secretary of State for Wales to make an Order under section 74 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, the effect of which will be that no person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 60 miles per hour on the following length of road:

Pontllanfraith—New Tredegar Road (Route A4049)—from a point 25 metres in a southerly direction from the south-eastern kerb-line of Bryngwyn Street, Fleur-de-Lys to the County boundary at Fleur-de-Lys a distance of approximately 294 metres.

A copy of the proposed Order, an explanatory statement and a map showing the length of road concerned, may be inspected at the Civic Centre, Pontllanfraith, and the County Hall, Cwmbran, during normal office hours (Monday to Friday).

Objections to the proposal, specifying the grounds on which they are made, should be sent in writing to the undersigned by not later than 15th December 1980.
