##### *Survey of Public Rights of Way for the City of Carlisle (Urban Area)*

Notice is hereby given that in accordance with section 30 National Parks and Access to the countryside Act 1949, the County Council has prepared a Provisional Definitive map and statement showing the public rights of way in the area of the former Carlisle County Borough Council. The relevant date of the map and statement is 1st January 1979.

Any owner, lessee or occupier of any land on which the Provisional Definitive Map for the City of Carlisle (Urban Area) shows a public path may, before 19th December 1980, apply to the Crown Court for any of the declarations set out in section 31 (1) of the 1949 Act, namely:

- (a) That at the relevant date of the map (1st January 1979) there was no public right of way over the land;
- (b) That the rights conferred on the public at that date by the public right of way over the land were such rights as may be specified in the application, and not such rights as are indicated in the provisional map and statement;
- (c) That the position or width of that part of the land over which the public right of way subsisted at the said date was specified in the application, and not as indicated in the provisional map and statement; or
- (d) That the public right of way over the land at the said date was not unconditional but was subject to limitations or conditions specified in the application, or, if the said right is indicated in the provisional statement as being subject to limitations or conditions, that the said right was subject to other limitations or conditions specified in the application either in addition to or in substitution for those indicated in the provisional statement.

##### NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

*Leicestershire County Council (Footpaths T.43, T.44 and T.45 Fenny Drayton) Public Path Extinguishment Diversion and Creation Order 1980.*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Leicestershire County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be:

- (a) to divert public footpath T.45 which extends from a point on the eastern boundary of Ordnance Survey (henceforth referred to as O.S.) Parcel No. 7165 and adjacent to the north-western corner of No. 37 Fox's Covert, Fenny Drayton and the south-western corner of the property known as Lodge Farm Cottages, in a generally north-westerly direction through O.S. Parcel Nos. 7165 and 5858 for a distance of approximately 190 metres to a point at Grid Reference 34629686 on the north-western boundary of O.S. parcel No. 5858 and adjacent to Drayton Lane, Fenny Drayton; to a line extending from the point adjacent to No. 37 Fox's Covert, previously described, in a generally west-north-westerly direction through O.S. Parcel Nos. 7165 and 5858 for a distance of approximately 280 metres to a point on the north-western boundary of O.S. Parcel No. 5858 where existing footpath T.44 joins Drayton Lane.
- (b) to extinguish in its entirety footpath T.43, which extends from a point adjacent to Nos. 34 and 35 Fox's Covert, in a generally south-westerly direction between those properties and through O.S. Parcel Nos. 7165 and 5858 for a distance of approximately 454 metres to its junction with footpath T.44 on the south-western boundary of O.S. Parcel No. 5858.
- (c) to create a new section of footpath to be designated T.44 which will extend from the point where existing footpath T.44 joins Drayton Lane, previously described in generally north-easterly and easterly directions to follow the north-western and northern boundaries of O.S. Parcel No. 5858 for a distance of approximately 387 metres to join Drayton Lane at a point at Grid Reference 34889692 approximately 48 metres north-west of the extreme north-eastern corner of O.S. Parcel No. 5858 and opposite the property known as "Roman Steps".

A copy of the Order and relevant map is available for inspection at Room 210, County Hall, Glenfield, Leicester.

Any representation or objection in respect of the Order may be sent in writing to the County Secretary, County Hall, Glenfield, Leicester LE3 8RA, not later than 19th December 1980, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representation or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Leicestershire County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
